NCCSAFE Hosts "Response to an Active Assailant Training" Public Safety Seminar

Ellicott City, M.d. (January 5, 2017) - The National Center for Citizen Safety (NCCSAFE), a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that spreads awareness on how to respond to domestic terrorism, is announcing their first public awareness workshop. The safety training will take place on Tuesday Feb. 7, from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. at the Charles E. Miller Branch & Historical Center.

The Response to an Active Assailant Training will provide participants with the knowledge base for preparedness and safety awareness in the event of an act of domestic terrorism incident. The event will feature the organization's A.C.T. public awareness campaign and provide resources and training to advise the general public on methodologies in the event of an incident.

Founder and Executive Director Lois Blevins said, "I believe every citizen should be trained on how to respond to an act of domestic terrorism. This safety workshop will be the first of its kind with NCCSAFE in partnership with HCPLS in Howard County."

This workshop has been made possible by NCCSAFE's recent co-sponsorship with Howard County Public Library System. This event will be open to the public-at-large and will also be attended by the organization's volunteers, friends and family.

NCCSAFE looks forward to successfully training participants on protocols for emergency preparedness in the event of an active assailant. This inaugural training marks the first of many seminars NCCSAFE will hold in order to meet our mission: to provide the general public with resources and to promote safety and awareness for this epidemic.
