## NCCSAFE Hosted Training Session at Salisbury University on April 30<sup>th</sup> with Student Organization

Ellicott City, M.D. (May 1, 2017)- The National Center for Citizen Safety (NCCSAFE) partnered with Girls on Top of the World, a community service group at Salisbury University to host a citizen safety workshop, "Response to an Active Assailant", on Sunday April 30 from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. at Salisbury University.

This workshop is aligned with NCCSAFE's mission to provide the public with resources and information to promote preparedness in the event of an active assailant situation. An on-site representative from the Salisbury University Police Department was in attendance at the safety workshop to be available for questions regarding first responder procedures.

This event was the first of its nature hosted on a college campus. It is the mission of NCCSAFE to ensure that every American should know how to A.C.T. (Assess, Cover Yourself, and Take Action), as President and Founder of NCCSAFE, Lois Blevins, says "as simply as we learned to 'Stop, Drop, and Roll' in kindergarten."

Blevins said "It is our mission to provide more free training throughout Howard County and additional counties in Maryland". Blevins hopes to partner with more groups on Salisbury's campus and even other university's in Maryland.

The workshop featured the organization's A.C.T. public awareness campaign, resources and training for the general public on how to respond to an active assailant. This event was held for a community service group on campus and the men's and women's swim teams. Blevins hopes to continue reaching out to groups on college campuses and to other organizations on the Eastern Shore.
