### A LETTER FROM MISS DEUTSCHER CLUB 2022/2023



Dear Members of the Deutscher Club,

t was my honor to serve as Miss Deutscher Club last year for the 2022-2023 term. Thank you again for your generous support of my non-profit project for a donation drive to St. Hubert's Animal Welfare Center. Thanks to your generosity, it was a big success.

I am writing to share that I have been elected President of the New

Jersey Society of the Children of the American Revolution. My term will be from April 2023- March 2024. The National Society of the Children of the American Revolution, founded in 1895, is the oldest patriotic youth organization in our country. Membership is open to descendants of patriots of the American Revo-



lution. From my father's side of the family, I can trace my ancestry to a soldier who fought in the Revolutionary War. Members gain valuable leadership experience in conducting meetings, following parliamentary procedures and standard protocol, serving as delegates, and speaking before groups at local, state and national conferences. I have been a member since 2015 and served in various board capacities before being elected as State President. As part of my duties, I am responsible for conducting a fundraising project. Since I was born in Germany and because of my German heritage, I decided to make my fundraiser about honoring the contributions of General von Steuben to the success of the patriot cause. My project is called "Saluting the Drillmaster of the Revolution". The State Project is to raise funds to restore and maintain the original condition of the Monmouth Battlefield during that pivotal battle on June 28, 1778, for the purchase and building of snake fencing. Snake fencing is a prominent feature of the battlefield and can be described as a zigzagging fence made of rails, which provided cover for American troops and slowed the movement of the British Army.

Before the Battle of Monmouth, the Continental Army was in need of discipline, training, and basis hygiene. Baron Friedrich Wilhelm von Steuben, a skilled Prussian officer, was introduced to General George Washington by Benjamin Franklin and recruited to train, prepare, and bring order to the troops. On February 23, 1778, von Steuben arrived at Valley Forge. General Washington was impressed by von Steuben's experience and knowledge and made him acting inspector general. As inspector general, von Steuben reorganized the camp for sanitary purposes and introduced training of soldiers in proper battle techniques and bayonets. Von Steuben wrote the training manual for the Continental Army, known as the "Blue Book," which was used by the American Army through the War of 1812. Von Steuben's training was tested at the Battle of Monmouth when the techniques were successful as the troops fought the British.

General Washington did not forget von Steuben's contribution to the revolution; he wrote to him in his final letter before resigning as commander, thanking him for his "faithful and meritorious Services."

Preserving and restoring the Monmouth Battlefield is vital for its historical significance, cultural heritage, and educational value. This project will ensure that future generations have the ability to learn from and appreciate this critical moment in American history. I was excited to see on Facebook that members of the German club cleaned the statue of General von Steuben just prior to the battle reenactment on June 17, 2023, at Monmouth Battlefield. We hope to have members join the reenactment next year! Stay tuned for details.



While this book can be read as a standalone, it is also the powerful conclusion to her story, begun in Katharina: Deliverance.

This year we celebrate the 66th German-American Steuben Parade in New York City. # Deutsche Ecke 👹

### **SCHWEIZER SEILBAHNEN**

Wer einmal die Schweiz besucht, ist sofort überwältigt von den prächtigen Bergen und Gletschern und gleich folgt die Frage, wie komme ich da hinauf? Vor weniger als 200 Jahren waren diese Natur-Riesen nur wenigen Bergsteigern und Einheimischen zugänglich. Aber heutzutage, mit der Verfügbarkeit der Gondelbahnen, Seilbahnen und Furniculairen ist es sogar Behinderten möglich, die spektakulären Gipfel zu erreichen. Seit der Eröffnung der ersten Seilbahn im Jahr 1866, haben die Schweizer Unternehmen überall verschiedene Lifte installiert. Erstaunlich, wie leicht es heutzutage ist, von der Stadt in kurzer Zeit nach oben zu kommen. Die Gletscherbahn zum Glacier (3.000 m) ist ein gutes Beispiel. Mit dem Postauto von Gstaad zur Seilbahnstation Les Diablerets (1.200 m.ü.M.). Von dort erreicht man in 15 Minuten mit der Seilbahn die erstaunliche Höhe von fast drei km (3.210m). Der Temperaturabfall empfiehlt dazu eine Jacke. Die Titlis Seilbahn ist die erste rotierende Seilbahn mit 360 Grad Panorama Aussicht. Oben angekommen, kann man die Gletscherhöhle besichtigen oder über die 100 Meter hohe Hängebrücke gehen. Aber nicht nur die Gipfeln der hohen Berge sind das Ziel, sondern auch die aufsehenerregenden Panoramen und Aussichten, die die modernen Gondelbahnen mit 'Glasscheiben' ermöglichen: Erinnerungen, die man nicht leicht vergisst. Mit einem Schweizer Reisepass kann man außer Zügen, Busse, Boote usw. auch einige Seilbahnen gratis gebrauchen, wie Bernina Express, Glacier Express, Golden Pass und mehr. Mit anderen Verkehrsträgern verglichen sind die Seilbahnen das sicherste Transportmittel. Unfälle passieren äußerst selten, und meistens nur beim Einund Ausstieg der Kabinen. Klein Matterhorn hat die höchste Seilbahnstation, oben mit 3.883 m.ü.M. und die längste der Welt ist die Grindelwald-Männlichen Gondeln Seilbahn, sie fährt 6 km in 30 Minuten. Nicht nur im Sommer, sondern ganz besonders im WInter fahren Gondolen (mit geschlossenen Kabinen für 4-15 Personen), Seilbahnen (100 Personen), Sesselliften (1-2) und Skilifte mit 2-4 und Rodelbahnen(1-2) auf und ab

von den Bergen. Funiculaire sind Kabinen, die ursprünglich durch Wasser geladen, nach oben fahren und auf dem Rückweg das Wasser ablaufen lassen. Die Schweiz ist eine Eidgenossenschaft, die aus 26 Kantonen(drei davon sind Halbkantonen) besteht und ihr Anfang geht auf 1291 zurück. Drei Ländergruppen (Schwyz, Uri und Unterwalden) schlossen einen ewigen Bund: der legendäre Rütli Schwur, der in dem Buch 'Wilhelm Teller'erwähnt wird. Im Laufe der fünf Jahrhunderten bildete dieser Schwur den Kern der heutigen Schweiz : Schweizerische Eidgenossenschaft, der lateinische Name: Confoederatio Helvetica, deshalb das Auto Abzeichen: CH, worüber sich manche Leute wundern. Viel Spass beim Bergbesuchen!

### **SWISS CABLE CARS**

Anyone who visits Switzerland is immediately overwhelmed by the magnificent mountains and glaciers and the question immediately follows, how do I get up there? Less than 200 years ago, these natural giants were only accessible to a few mountaineers and locals. But nowadays, with the availability of gondolas, cable cars and funiculars, even the disabled can reach the spectacular peaks. Since the opening of the first cable car in 1866, Swiss companies have installed various lifts everywhere. It's amazing how easy it is these days to get up from the city in a short amount of time.





The Gletscherbahn to the Glacier (9,842ft) is a good example. By bus you travel from Gstaad to the Les Diablerets cable car station (3,937ft above sea level) and from there, a 15-minute cable car ride takes you to the astonishing height of almost 1.8 miles. The drop in temperature suggests a jacket is needed for this trip. The Titlis cable car is the first rotating cable car with a 360-degree panoramic view. Once at the top, you can visit the glacier cave or walk over the 328 ft high suspension bridge. Not only the peaks of the high mountains are the goal, but also the sensational panoramas and views that the modern gondolas with 'glass panes' make possible: memories that are not easily forgotten. Besides trains, buses, boats, etc., a Swiss passport will allow you to use some cable cars for free such as: Bernina Express, Glacier Express, Golden Pass and more. Compared to other modes of transport, cable cars are the safest means of transport. Accidents happen extremely rarely, and mostly only when entering and exiting the cabins. Klein Matterhorn has the highest cable car station, at 12,739 ft. above sea level. The longest in the world is the Grindelwald-Mannlichen gondola cable car, which travels 3.7 miles in 30 minutes. Not only in summer but especially in winter, gondolas (with closed cabins for 4-15 people), cable cars (100 people), chairlifts (1-2) and ski lifts with 2-4 and toboggans run (with 1-2) on and off the mountains. Funiculars are cabins that were initially powered using water as a counterweight for the climb and releasing the water on the way back. Switzerland is a confederation made up of 26 cantons (three of which are semi-cantons) whose beginning dates back to 1291. In the 15th century, three Swiss Cantons, Schwyz, Uri and Unterwalden founded an everlasting bond: the legendary Rütli Oath, mentioned in Schiller's book 'Wilhelm Tell'. Over the course of five centuries, this oath formed the core of what is now Switzerland, Swiss Confederation, the Latin name: Confoederatio Helvetica, determines the Swiss vehicle license I.D.: CH, questioned by many. Have fun visiting the mountains!

### **Bernard Kroger – Grocer**

Bernard Heinrich Kroger was born in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1860 to German immigrant parents from Hanover and Elve, Westphalia. As the fifth of ten children, Kroger had to quit school



at 13 to help support the family. After working several jobs, Kroger was hired as a door-to-door salesman for the Great Northern and Pacific Tea Company. Kroger became a manager of the failing grocery and was able to turn profits around. When he asked

to become a partner in the company, the owners refused. Kroger then asked his friend Irish immigrant B.A. Branagan to join him in starting their own company. With \$372.00 in borrowed money, they established their store in downtown Cincinnati. In time, Kroger wanted more control in the business and bought out Branagan. He soon established four stores within the city. Bernard Kroger is credited with inventing the supermarket as we know it today. Kroger realized that customers had to go to a butcher, a baker, and a grocery store, so he combined all three for onestop shopping. Customers could select what they wanted and see the price immediately. He created a private label brand at less cost when his mother made sauerkraut from a bounty of cabbages.




Kroger delivered groceries to houses, advertised in newspapers, bought in bulk and paid cash to providers. He was sensitive to price increases, closed stores at 7:00 PM so his workers could go home and expanded his stores to neighboring states. By the end of the 1920's Kroger had acquired and opened over 5,500 stores. He sold the company for \$28,000,000 in 1927. Other businesses included banking, railroads, and a run for governor. Kroger's charity was wide ranging and generous. He died in 1938 in his summer house on Cape Cod, MA. Today the Kroger Company is the largest grocer with 2,800 stores in 35 states operating under 28 different names



still adhering to Bernard Kroger's motto: "Be particular. Never sell anything you would not want yourself." *Barbara Streit*
