DIE SANDUHR

Eine Sanduhr (auch: Stundenglas) ist ein Einfaches, etwa seit Anfang des 14. Jahrhunderts bekanntes Zeitmessgerät. Seine früheste Darstellung findet sich auf dem 1338 von Ambrogio Lorenzetti erschaffenen Fresko "Allegorie der Guten Regierung" im Palazzo Pubblico (Siena). Ausdrücklich erwähnt wird die Sanduhr 1379 in einem Inventarverzeichnis Karls V. von Frankreich. Allerdings verweisen bereits frühere Quellen des 14. Jahrhunderts auf sie als "gläserne Uhren", die zur Zeitmessung gebräuchlich waren. Der genaue Ursprung der Sanduhr ist ungeklärt. Die ältesten Sanduhren bestanden aus zwei einzelnen Glaskolben, die an ihrem Hals miteinander verbunden waren. Der Sand floss durch eine Lochblende von einem Kolben in den anderen. Diese Lochblenden nutzten sich aber durch den Gebrauch der Uhr langsam ab und wurden durch Abrieb geweitet. Dadurch rieselte der Sand schneller durch die Blende und die Laufdauer der Sanduhr verringerte sich. Ab 1750 konnten jedoch Sanduhren aus einem Stück gefertigt werden, bei denen an die Stelle der Lochblende eine haltbare Einengung zwischen den Glaskolben trat. Den Sand füllte man über eine kleine Öffnung im Glasboden ein. die dann z.B. mit Wachs oder mit einem Korken verschlossen wurde. Ab etwa 1800 konnten die Sanduhren durch nachträgliches Verschmelzen der Einfüllöffnung vollständig versiegelt werden. Sand ist als Füllung für gewöhnlich ungeeignet. Es braucht eine feine Körnung, möglichst kugelige Kornform und Abriebfestigkeit. Die einzelnen Partikel dürfen nicht verkleben und müssen unempfindlich gegenüber Temperaturund Luftfeuchtigkeitsschwankungen sein. Im Spätmittelalter wurden neben Marmorstaub und Zinn- oder Bleisand auch feingemahlene

sind Mischungen für die spezielle Zubereitung des Gemischs bekannt. Es wurde fein gesiebt, gewaschen und klassiert und nach Vorschrift abgekocht. Heute verwendet man zur Füllung sehr feine Glasperlen. Der Glaskörper der

Sanduhr ist sehr empfindlich gegenüber Stößen. Zum Schutz und damit man die Sanduhr aufstellen kann, wird sie in eine Halterung montiert. Für die Laufzeit einer Sanduhr ist nicht unbedingt ihre Größe ausschlaggebend. Beträgt ihre Laufzeit allerdings mehrere Tage oder Wochen, muss sie schon ziemlich groß sein. Zwei solcher Riesen sind das "Zeitrad in Budapest" und die "Sanduhr im Sandmuseum" der japanischen Stadt Nima. Mit einer Höhe von acht und sechs Metern und einer Laufzeit von jeweils einem Jahr

gehören sie weltweit zu den größten Zeitmessern. Ein weiterer Gigant stand im Juli 2008 im Rahmen eines Marketingevents auf dem Roten Platz in Moskau. Mit einer Höhe von 11,90 m und einem Gewicht von 40 Tonnen handelte es sich vermutlich um das größte Stundenglas der Welt. Im Gegensatz dazu misst die kleinste Sanduhr der Welt nur eine Höhe von 2,4 cm. Sie wurde 1992 in Hamburg, Deutschland, angefertigt und benötigt für einen Durchlauf etwas weniger als 5 Sekunden. Eine der größten Sanduhren steht in Mainz, Deutschland.

THE HOURGLASS

A Sand Clock, (also called Hourglass) is a simple time-telling piece, from about the beginning of the 14th century. Its earliest depiction can be found on the fresco "Allegory of Good Government" in the Palazzo Pubblico (Siena), created by Ambrogio Lorenzetti in 1338. The



hourglass is explicitly mentioned in an inventory in 1379 of Charles V. of France. However, earlier sources from the 14th century refer to them as "glass clocks" that were used to measure time. The exact origin of the hourglass is unclear. The oldest hourglasses consisted of two individual Glass pistons, which were connected to each other at the neck. The sand flowed through a pinhole from one flask to the other. However,

these pinholes slowly wore out using the watch, by abrasion. As a result, the sand trickled faster through the aperture and the running time of the hourglass was reduced. From 1750 on however, hourglasses would be made from one piece, in which the pinhole was replaced by a durable constriction between the glass bulbs. The sand was filled through a small opening in the glass bottom, which was then closed with wax or a cork, for example. From about 1800 on the hourglasses could be completely sealed by subsequent fusion of the

filling opening. Sand is usually unsuitable as a filling. It needs a fine granulation, preferably spherical grain shape and abrasion resistance. The individual particles must not stick together and must be insensitive to temperature and humidity fluctuations. In the late Middle Ages, finely ground eggshells were used, in addition to marble dust and tin or lead sand. Since the 13th century, mixtures for the special preparation of the "Sand" are known. It was sifted, washed, broken down according to grain size and boiled as prescribed. Today, very fine glass beads are used for the filling. The vitreous body of the hourglass is very sensitive to shocks. For protection and so that one can set up the hourglass, it is mounted in a holder. The running time of an hourglass is not necessarily determined by its size. However, if its runtime is several days or weeks, it must be quite large. There are two such giants, the "Time Wheel in Budapest" and the hourglass in the "Sand Museum" in the Japanese city of Nima. With a height of eight and six meters and a running time of one year each, they are among the largest timepieces in the world. In July 2008, another giant was present at a marketing event on the Red Square in Moscow. With a height of 11.90 meters and a weight of 40 tons, it was probably the largest hourglass in the world. In contrast, the smallest hourglass in the world measures only 2.4 centimeters in height. It was made in 1992 in Hamburg, Germany, and it takes a little less than 5 seconds to run. One of the largest hourglasses is located in Mainz, Germany.

Henry Kissinger – Secretary of State

Henry Kissinger (Heinz Alfred Kissinger) was born in Fuerth, Germany in 1923 to a homemaker and a schoolteacher. The Kissinger family was Jewish and fled



to the United States in 1938. They settled in the Washington Heights section of New York City where Henry finished high school at night and worked in a factory that made shaving brushes during the day. After high school, he attended the City College of New York part time until he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1943, the same year that he became a naturalized U.S. citizen. While in the Army, Kissinger's intelligence and German language skills allowed him to assist in military intelligence operations and the denazification efforts after the war ended. Back in the U.S., Kissinger received a BA, MA, and PhD in political science from Harvard University, and in 1954 he joined the faculty of his alma mater. Kissinger stayed at Harvard until 1969 acting as a consultant to several government agencies. In 1968, Presidentelect Richard Nixon chose Kissinger to be his National Security Adviser and later, also his new Secretary of State. His major diplomatic achievements involved China, the Soviet Union, Vietnam and the Middle East. Kissinger played a major role in the disengagement of U.S. troops from South Vietnam. In 1972, Kissinger began peace talks with Le Duc Tho of North Vietnam. For the proposed resolution of the Vietnam Conflict Henry Kissinger and Le Duc Tho shared the 1973 Nobel Prize for Peace (Le

Duc Tho refused the honor). Kissinger stayed in his position as Secretary of State under President Ford until 1977. He then advised others on various boards, including his own international consulting firm. Kissinger continued to be active by writing numerous books, articles and columns,

and participated in many discussions with the media. Awards and honors for Henry Kissinger are extensive and include the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the United States highest civilian honor. Henry Kissinger is still active today at 100 years of age. Barbara Streit
