Ratskeller. Some of the books we have read include: All the Light You Cannot See, 40 Autumns, Katarina: Fortitude, and The Boys in the Boat. In January, we discussed The German Wife by Kelly Rimmer, a fictionalized account of Werner von Braun's family. Von Braun was the German genius who built the V2 rocket. The book moves with jumping timelines from pre-World War II, to the war, and after when he and his family are moved to America to lead its rocket development program. It focuses on the relationships between the fictionalized von Braun's wife and the Texas-born wife of his boss. The book raises numerous questions. One concerns how decent Germans managed in the Nazi world. Others deal with relationships, duty, and sacrifice. Please note that everyone is welcome to join our lively and informative discussions, even if they have not read the book. HISTORY COMMITTEE





DER RING DES NIBELUNGEN UND DIE VIKINGER

Richard Wagner, der weltweit bekannte Komponist, schuf sein größtes Werk, Der Ring, der aus vier monumentalen Opern besteht: Das Rheingold, Die Walküre, Siegfried und Götterdämmerung. Diese Opern, mit Themen aus der germanischen Mythologie und dem Gedicht, das originale Nibelungenlied, (1200) beschäftigten den Komponist über mehr als ein Viertel Jahrhundert, während er auch noch andere Opern komponierte. Die Geschichte des Rings (in Kürze) erzählt von einem Ring der Götter mit magischer Kraft, die dem Träger die Fähigkeit gibt, die Welt zu regieren. Der Ring wurde von dem Nibelungen Zwerg Alberich aus dem Gold des Rheingold Schatzes geschmiedet, den er von den Rhein-Töchtern gestohlen hatte. In der Oper Siegfried heisst der Zwerg Mime, Siegfried tötete den heimtückischen Mime und nahm dessen Ring, der ihm die Macht des Rings gab. Siegfried ist Enkel des Gottes Wotan (Halb Gott), zerbricht dessen Speer, von dem Wotan die Kraft und Autorität über die Götter erhielt. Siegfried schmiedet sich ein Schwert aus den Teilen von Wotans Speer, mit dem er den Drachen Fafnir tötet. Danach badete er sich in dem Drachenblut und wurde so unverwundbar, bis auf eine kleine Stelle auf seinem Rücken, wohin ein Blatt gefallen war. Das, kurzgefasst, ist der Inhalt von Siegfrieds Oper. Die Uraufführung von Siegfried fand 1876 im Bayreuther Festspielhaus statt, als ein Teil der ganzen Aufführung Der Ring des Nibelungen. Was hat all dies mit den Vikinger zu tun? In der Uraufführung wurde nicht an Kostümen und Kulissen gespart. Carl Emil Doepler, Künstler und Maler war damals der Kostümbildner und er entwarf, unter anderem, die Kleidung der Götter. Hier für die Kopfbedeckungen der Götter entwarf Doepler Hörner auf beiden Seiten der Helme. Somit begann danach der Mythos, dass die Vikinger, starke männliche Vorbilder in Schlachten, auch Hörner an den Helmen hatten, obwohl es keinen direkten Beweis in archäologischen Forschungen dafür gibt. Ganz selten erschienen die Vikinger wahrscheinlich mit dekorierten Hörner bei besonderen Festlichkeiten, aber auf ihren Reisen und auch Schiffen tru-

gen sie nur Kopfbedeckungen ohne Hörner.

THE RING OF THE NIBELUNGEN AND THE VIKINGS

ichard Wagner, the world-renowned composer, cre-Nated his greatest work, The Ring, which consists of four monumental operas: Das Rheingold, Die Walküre (The Valkyrie, Wotan's daughter) Siegfried, and Götterdämmerung (Dawn of the Gods). These operas, with themes from Germanic mythology and the poem, the original Nibelungenlied, (song of the Nibelungen, 1200), occupied the composer for more than a guarter of a century, while he also composed other operas. The Story of the Ring (in short) tells of a ring of the gods with magical power that gives the wearer the ability to rule the world. The ring was forged by the Nibelung dwarf Alberich (named Mime in the opera) from the gold of the Rheingold treasure, which he had stolen from the Rhein Daughters. In the opera Siegfried, the Dwarf is named Mime. Siegfried killed the treacherous Mime and took his ring, which gave him the power of the ring. Siegfried (half God) is the grandson of the god Wotan, breaks the latter's spear, from which Wotan had received power and authority over the gods. Siegfried forges a sword



from the parts of Wotan's spear and uses it to kill the dragon Fafnir. He then bathed in the dragon's blood and became invulnerable, except for a small spot on his back, where a leaf had fallen. That, in a nutshell, is the content of the Siegfried opera. The premiere of Siegfried took place in 1876 at the Bayreuth Festival Hall, as part of the complete performances of The RIng of the Nibelungen. What does all of this have to do with the Vikings? At the premiere no expense was spared on costumes and sets. Carl Emil Doepler, artist and painter, was the costume designer at the time and among other things, he designed the clothing of the gods. Here for the headgear of the gods, Doepler designed horns on both sides of the helmets. Thus, after that, the myth began that the Vikings, strong male role models in battles, also had horns on their helmets, although there is no direct evidence of this in archaeological research. The Vikings probably appeared very rarely at special celebrations with decorated horns, but on their journeys and ships they only wore headgear without horns. -Barbara Oberdina



PAUL EHRLICH – IMMUNOLOGIST

Paul Ehrlich was born in Strehlen, Prussia in 1854. After attending several universities, including Breslau, Strasbourg, Freiburg, and Leipzig, Ehrlich graduated with a medical degree from the University of Leipzig in 1878. He soon began collaborating with his cousin, Carl Weigert, a pathologist pioneering in aniline dyes as biological cell stains. Next, Ehrlich was offered a position as head of Charite Hospital in Berlin. There Ehrlich developed a technique to identify tuberculosis bacillus and laid the foundation for the field of hematology. Ehrlich continued to research boosting immunity through antitoxins at the Royal Prussian Institute for Experimental Therapy. In 1897, Ehrlich was appointed Public Health Officer at Frankfurt-am-Main, then Director in 1899. Here, Ehrlich pursued chemotherapy, expressed as "Magic Bullets" which would go directly to the organisms which they were targeted. Ehrlich and his fellow researchers developed an arsenic compound that they called Salvarsan which was successful in the initial treatment of syphilis. Salvarsan, and the improved Neosalvarsan, remained the standard treatment for syphilis until the 1940's advent of antibiotics. Paul Ehrlich married and had two children. He died in 1915 but was able to receive many titles and awards in his lifetime, including the 1908 Nobel Prize for medicine. Other awards after his death included a street naming in Frankfurt-Sachsenhausen, schools and pharmacies named in his honor, a postage stamp in 1954, a moon crater in 1970 and a 200 Deutsche Mark bank note in 2001. Additionally, in 1940 his life and work were featured in the US film Dr. Ehrlich's Magic Bullet with Edward G. Robinson in the title role. The film was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay. -Barbara Streit
