and accordion accompaniment. All the guys who like to sing or want to learn how (don't think you can't! It's easier





THE GERMAN-AMERICAN STEUBEN PARADE IN NYC Saturday, September 16th, 2023



This year we celebrate the 66th German-American Steuben Parade in New York City. Established in 1957 with the first Steuben Parade held in Yorkville (known as Germantown), it celebrated German, Austrian, and Swiss-American heritage and culture and has grown into the largest event of its kind in the United States. Today, the parade continues to march up 5th Avenue to 86th Street, led by cadets representing the German Language Club of the West

Point Military Academy, founded by General von Steuben himself. The three-hour parade is filled with German groups wearing their traditional costumes, spectacular floats, marching bands, dancers, clubs, and organizations from across the United States, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, and Canada. DISPLAY YOUR DC PRIDE in New York City, down 5th Avenue in Blue and White • Traditional attire for members is white shirt/blouse, navy tie (for men), and navy trousers/skirt. Members once again, have the option of marching "in Tracht." Dirndl & Lederhosen are welcome. 
This Fall we will again work with VI-TALANT Services for our Blood Drive on Saturday October 21st.



Tis me, the well-known cypher, the widely traveled Pied Piper, Whom this





Albert Ballin – Pleasure Cruising

Albert Ballin was born in Hamburg in 1857. When he was 17 his father died, and he and his brother Joseph took over the family's passenger ship booking service. In 1877, Albert's brother decided to become a stockbroker. Ballin became the sole operator of the business and turned it into a thriving enterprise. He teamed up with the English Carr Line and became the Chief Passenger Agent. He then made ships more comfortable for steerage passengers during the booming emigration to North America during the 1880's. Next, the English Carr Line merged with Hapag (the Hamburg America



Line) and Ballin became the head of the passenger department. Hapag grew to become the largest shipping company in the world. With beautifully built luxury liners, Ballin could put low-cost steerage passengers in large spaces and design upper decks to rival aristocratic homes and hotels for wealthy passengers. Sailing became popular for wealthy clients, and soon ships were designed just for pleasure cruising. On January 22, 1891, Albert Ballin and

his wife Marianne and 241 passengers took the first Mediterranean pleasure cruise. It lasted 57 days. First-class cabins, first-class cuisine, a ballroom, dining room and a daily newspaper were all parts of the experience. In 1901, Ballin established the International Mercantile Marine Company and became a frequent advisor to Kaiser Wilhelm II. Ballin tried many behind the scenes negotiations to prevent World War I. In 1914, he organized food supplies for the blockaded Reich and set up its central purchasing agency. He remained a moderate in his political ideas and fell out of favor with the Kaiser. As the war progressed, the Kaiser abdicated, Ballin was considered a traitor, and the Hapag business was destroyed. Upset and depressed, Albert Ballin took his own life on November 9, 1918. Today, Albert Ballin is remembered as the first top manager of Germany. Hamburg has renamed streets and buildings in his honor and has commemorated Alfred Ballin with a German Postage stamp.
