It's Mulch Time

West Canyon Drive home numbers 189-263 will be mulched this year in June by Willow River Landscaping. One-third of our homes are mulched every year, so your home will be mulched by the Association once every three years. You may add mulch to your home at your expense any time, but it must be **Premium Cedar Mulch**, sold at Menards. You will be asked to remove and replace any other mulch or rock you use.

Landscaping – Never-Ending Work in the Association

The landscape project to remove and replace unsightly and aging low yews and spirea shrubs continues this summer and likely for one more year. Homeowners whose plants have been earmarked for removal and for replacements have been notified by Cities Management. If you receive new shrubs this year, please help them adapt by watering them daily for at least 10 days to make sure they thrive!

Fifteen maple trees were planted in the Association this Spring--14 along West Canyon Drive and one replacement on Deerwood Court. This planting was recommended by the previous Landscape Committee to address the loss of several aspen and ash trees. The maples also provide a consistent and planned landscape look with the trees already on the opposite side of West Canyon Drive.

Don't Just Start Digging!

If you want to remove or add ground plantings *in your mulched areas only*, you must submit **Architectural, Landscape or Irrigation Modification Request**, to Cities Management. This is for documentation and board approval, and to ensure protection of buried irrigation lines, etc. (No approval is required for flowerpots in the mulched areas!)

But first, review the **Guidelines for Modifying Landscaping Within the Mulched Areas**. Guidelines and form are both on the Cities Management website. Print the form, complete it, and send it to Cities Management. If you cannot print, call Cities Management, 612-381-8600, to make your request. *Remember, don't start digging until your request is reviewed and approved!*

How to Find the Cities Management Website and RCCTA Policies

At citiesmanagement.com, click on My Account at the top. Click on "Cities Management" in the list of branches. Sign in or click on "register" to set up an account.

To find landscaping information and the form once signed in, click on "Community Information" in the left menu, then click on "Property Information" in the drop-down menu. You'll see "Guide for Modifying Landscape Within the Mulch Area." Read this first. Then click on "Architectural, Landscape or Irrigation Modification Application" (the form). Scroll down to see lists of approved perennials, shrubs and small trees. Print, complete and send this form to Cities Management. The address is on the form.

Patio Enjoyment with Fire-Table Units

Please note that in-ground firepits are prohibited. Firepits (fire-table units) that are allowed must be portable and fueled by electricity, propane or natural gas.
