### A Word from our Treasurer Tim...


With the exception of 2015 - when a generous legacy of £49,301 boosted reserves, annual income has steadily declined over the last 10 years. At the 31 December 2017 - Society net worth amounted to £230,051 and this included an amount of £58,000 for the provision for members spiritual benefits.

Over the two years 2016 and 2017 charitable alms giving and, providing a further £10,000 for the provision of future spiritual benefits, has run down our unrestricted reserves by c£40k to c£172k. These are the reserves available for covering the costs of running the Society together with funds for alms giving - in the future.

It would be in keeping with our forebears to continue giving generously and to that end, at the 2018 AGM, members kindly agreed to increase annual subscriptions to £10 from 2019.

To enable the Society to continue relieving hardship by making grants of money, the board of management and trustees would welcome members considering making additional donations and providing legacies to the Society.

### 233rd Annual General Meeting Whit Tuesday 2019

At next year's Annual General Meeting, the two lay-representatives of the Liverpool Archdiocese on the Board of Management will be elected to hold office for three years, followed by the Salford Diocese in 2020. and the Lancaster Diocese in 2021.

The present lay-representatives may offer themselves for re-election when their three years in office have expired. The capacity to represent a particular diocese shall be determined by the Member's place of abode and not by the place of work or worship. Nominations to replace the existing lay-representatives of the Liverpool Archdiocese, shall have the consent of the nominee. They must be made in writing and forwarded to the Secretary not later than 1st March 2019, to allow for inclusion in the 2019 Whitsun newsletter and shall be supported by the signatures of at least five fully paid up members of one year's standing who reside in the Liverpool Archdiocese



## **Blue Plaque**

A blue plaque is a permanent sign installed in a public place in the United Kingdom and elsewhere to commemorate a link between that location and a famous person, event, or former building on the site, serving as a historical

marker.



The Broughton Society has a Plaque installed on the former Golden Ball at Broughton Crossroads in 2005, however The Golden Ball, which dates back to the early 17th century and now called 'A Touch of Spice' Indian Restaurant is, we understand, due to be demolished to make way for a 36-bedroom retirement complex, and an office block and four retail units built in the restaurant's place.

Contact is being made with the site owners and Preston Historical Society to see what options we have for the future of the Plaque and any potential relocation etc. should that become necessary. If any member has further information on this, please contact the Secretary.
