OLD BUSINESS

2023 Budget reductions and increase

Supervisor Kauffman announced that Supervisors and Jane have met with department heads concerning 2023 budget and cuts. Budget is 500k general fund. Areas to save would be to increase sewer admin fee. 75k to 105k. Decrease contributions. No printed news letter in 2023. National Night Out will still have a contribution of 5k. Decreased advertising budget by 3k. Reduced capital improvements budget by 10,000.. Increase tax collecting budget up 5000.00 for EIN & LST. Reduced propane budget 10,000 based on past usage .

No 19th officer will be added, Uniform maint reduced by 6500.00, Office supplies reduced by 2000. Building Maintenance will be reduced by 5000, No longer purchasing two vehicles savings of 125,000 ammunition reduced by 1500.00.

Public Safety Directors wages cut by 2000.00 Operation supplies reduced by 10,000.

Hghway vehicles will still be purchased but looking into low rate financing for four years.

EMS and Sewer building budgets changed

Budget is balanced

Budget needs to be approved at the December 13 meeting.

Multi Use Building Emergency Services

Chairman Kirkpatrick announced that the Township was awarded a 2 million RACP grant towards the building. Still meeting with contractor to see where cuts can be made on the cost of the building.

NEW BUSINESS

York Haven Borough 2023 police agreement

MOTION By Supervisor Kauffman to approve police agreement for 2023. Supervisor Kauffman approved, Vice Chairman Harkins seconded the motion, carried unanimously. Tony Miller explained the contract. LT. Diddy followed up.

Goldsboro Borough 2023 police agreement

MOTION By Vice Chairman Harkins to approve the contract with Goldsboro Bourough, Supervisor Wintermyer, seconded the motion, carried unanimously. Lt. Diddy followed up. Dave Parsons, resident asked what line item this was on the budget. Carried unanimously.

Resolution 2022-22 payment of GSL commission from the general fund

This is the two million dollar grant writer for the multi-use emergency services building

MOTION By Supervisor Kauffman to pay the commission of \$240,000. This motion, seconded by Supervisor Wintermyer, carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS cont. 2023 Snow Removal Bids

Reibein Service Center \$175.00 an hour with 11' plow with salt spreader. Firewood Extractors \$130.00 an hour with a 9' plow and \$165.00 an hour with a John Deere Tractor with a 10' plow

MOTION Supervisor Kauffman to accept both snow removal bids for 2023. This motion, seconded by Chairman Kirkpatrick , carried unanimously.

Penn Waste rate increase

Tony Miller announced that York County Resource recovery facility has increased Penn Wastes Dump rate by \$2.00 per ton. Penn Waste will increase quarterly rate by .61 cents per home. The old rate was \$88.08 and new rate will be \$88.69 per quarter

MOTION Vice Chair Harkins to honorably discharge Sgt. Bosco, This motion seconded by Supervisor WIntermyer, carried unanimously

MOTION Supervisor Kauffman to approve hiring of Administrative Assistant, This motion seconded by Vice Chair Harkins carried unanimously


PAYMENT OF BILLS
