Sharing Photos/News for CDCTS Newsletter and Website

Sharing photos and club news is part of the fun of the newsletter and website. While we can't post every photo we have, or receive, in the club's publications we try to highlight the club's activities. Part of that means providing the reader the best quality we are able to collect and put together.

We now have a new email address, <code>cdctsnews@gmail.com</code>, designated for collecting photos/news for the club's publications. This email address will help us prevent the possible loss of photos/news due to oversight in personal email accounts and encourage the collection of better photos. The use of this new email account is especially important for transferring photos. The quality of a photo will be best preserved by sending it through an email account. There are other, even better, ways to send and maintain the original quality of a photo but we're using the easiest method for the sender by using an email account.

Sending/Transferring Photos

CDCTS publications are primarily shared through the internet. Photo requirements for internet publications, website and pdfs, is not nearly as restrictive as for print quality photos (72DPI vs 300DPI). Great photos, however, can easily slip into blurry images due to internet transfer. Anytime you send a photo to someone through Facebook, messaging service or text messages your images are likely to be greatly compressed. This is done to save band width. How much depends on the carrier.

We're often able to use some Facebook photos as they are less compressed than other services and can be used for web publications. A photo sent via text message is almost never usable. While a cell phone photo (even one with a great camera) looks perfect, once it's transferred through one of these services it begins to lose its clarity.

How To Send Photos Without Losing Quality Using Email

- 1. Click on New Email or Compose.
- 2. Type in the CDCTS Photos/News email address (cdctsnews@gmail.com) as the intended recipient.
- 3. Fill in the subject, and optional body text.
- 4. Click Attach File, and select the images from your files that you want to send.
- 5. Click on the Send button when ready.

How To Send Photos Directly From Your Phone Using Email

When you open a photo:

On Android phones, the "share" button looks like a "less-than" sign, with a circle at each point. Son iPhones, it's an arrow pointing out of a square.

n, and use, your email

When you click on the "share" button there will be apps for sharing the photo. Click on, and use, your email app. Enter the cdcts newsletter address and send.

No matter which platform you're using, the purpose of the button is the same. Just remember to send it via email.

If you have several photos you may have to send them through separate emails. This will depend on your email account and how much data is allowed to be sent in one email.


