#### I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by CDCTS President Carolyn Ordal at 7:17 p.m. on February 8, 2022. The meeting was held via Zoom.

New board members of Lynn Holtman and Dene Massengill were approved at the brief board meeting at the February 5, 2022 banquet.

## III. Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting

Minutes from January 8, 2022 were provided to all members in the February 2022 newsletter. A motion to accept the minutes as presented was made by Rita Dunn and seconded by Melissa Morehead.

## **IV. Committee Reports**

## Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's Report was read by Melissa Morehead. A motion to accept the Treasurers Report as presented was made by Susan Hill and seconded by Carolyn Ordal.

## **Show Committee:**

- The spring schooling show will be held at Icon Equestrian Center on May 7, 2022. In addition to our regular classical and western dressage tests, the show will include combined training tests and working equitation dressage test as Test of Choice. The rider will need to provide two (2) copies of the desired Test of Choice to the show management. A proposed budget and prize list are needed from Melissa Morehead and Susan Hill. The concession budget was provided to the board by email from Carolyn Ordal. Insurance coverage to be confirmed by Carolyn Ordal. The cost of the judge needs to be determined by the committee. New USEA and WDAA dressage test were implemented 12/01/2021 and need to be identified in the prize list as well as the club's judges notebook currently in the possession of Marge Williams. The club needs to provide a porta potty.
- Ride a Test Clinic with "S" judge Donna Richardson, a CDCTS club member, will be held at Topperhill
  Farm, Lenoir City, TN on April 2, 2022. A maximum of 8 riders for this clinic. The cost will be \$70.00 for
  CDCTS members and \$85.00 for non-members. Auditing fee is \$20.00. The proposed budget will be
  provided by Susan Hill. Carolyn Ordal will ensure proper insurance coverage is obtained. The clinic is full
  at this time.
- Summer schooling show will be held June 25, 2022 at Walnut Grove Stables, hosted by CDCTS member
  Dene Massengill. In addition to our regular classical and western dressage tests, the show will include
  working equitation dressage and obstacle classes. The show will not include combined training classes.
  Carolyn Ordal will ensure proper insurance coverage is obtained. The club will look into obtaining
  additional working equitation obstacles. Melissa Morehead will continue to search for a judge. The club
  needs to provide a porta potty.
- Continued discussion about the location for the fall schooling show and Melissa Morehead will continue to search for a venue.
- Julie Hall will draft changes to the CDCTS awards documents discussed in January 2022 and email to the board for review and approval prior to distribution to the general membership, newsletter and website.
- Susan Hill proposed a special award for High Point at the schooling shows in lieu of a High Point ribbon. This would start with the fall schooling show and would be for Junior and Adult Amateur only.
- A discussion was had regarding judges for the schooling shows. Julie Hall will obtain a Judges List from the USDF website and provide to Susan Hill and Melissa Morehead.

## GOALS FOR THE YEAR

## Strategy for the 2022 Dressage Competition Season

We all, at one time or another, think about our "New Year's Resolutions." Same thing here, only this applies to a dressage competition season. As Carolyn mentioned in her letter to the club, "it's a good time to plan ahead for CDCTS shows and events."

One of the things I consider early in the competition year, is "What are my goals?" Actually, my trainer, Susan Hill, usually asks me this question and it forces me to think about and verbalize my goals. They aren't written in stone, and they can change, but they do give me a sense of what I would like to accomplish.

Along with thinking about and verbally stating those competition goals, comes developing a strategy to achieve them. I also think about the reward, or the carrot at the end of the stick. This could be a sense of personal achievement, a USDF award or a CDCTS year end award.

## How do I put together a strategy to achieve those competition season goals?

I start by drafting an excel spreadsheet with all of the shows – schooling and rated, in date order, judge's name if I have it, and what level I plan to compete in. I always try to keep in mind that I want to support CDCTS, River Glen and Scenic Flight. I decide how many shows I feel I can successfully compete in and can my horse Rudy handle that. I then decide which shows will be included in my competition strategy and indicate which test I anticipate riding at each show. I plan, God willing and the creek doesn't rise, to ride the highest test of the level by the end of the season.

I also try to keep a cushion at the end of the season in case I have a less than desirable score on a test and feel I need to ride that test over again. I don't delete any listed shows, just highlight those I am interested in.

Once I have this information charted, I review everything to consider - "Is my schedule reasonable? Are my goals for the competition year achievable? Will Rudy and I survive?" So far, we've survived through Training and First Level with this strategy. We'll see what happens in 2022 when we dip our toes in Second Level.

Throughout the competition season, I keep the excel spreadsheet updated with my scores and placings so that it gives me a good idea of how I am doing as I try to meet those stated goals. The spreadsheet also serves to show me if I need to rethink and/or reorganize my show schedule depending on circumstances. It also helped me stay motivated to keep going!

## What are the desired rewards that come with a competition season strategy?

I have an amazing Morgan horse, Rudy, and I strive to promote that breed wherever we go. Part of my personal reward is recognition of the Morgan Horse breed. We are often asked about Rudy's breeding and we're more than happy to tell people "He's a Morgan!" We are members of the Morgan Dressage Association and American Morgan Horse Association, who each offer very nice awards. In 2021, we received our Bronze Medallion and Third Place First Level from the American Morgan Horse Association Open Competition program against other breeds across

the United States. From the Morgan Dressage Association, we competed against other Morgan horses across the United States and were awarded Reserve Champion at First Level and Reserve Champion at Second Level with Jennifer Swindle riding. I was thrilled that Rudy was able to achieve those goals with me!!!

While we only showed at rated shows in 2021, CDCTS has a beautiful year end award for high point schooling show scores. It struck me, in 2021, no one submitted schooling show scores, which is unfortunate.

Without goals, strategies, motivation to achieve them, and a fantastic support system, we may not have been as successful in 2021 as we were. Thank you to all those people who were part of our 2021 dressage competition journey! Here's to 2022!



## **Competitor Information**

#### **Entries**:

All entries MUST include a copy of a current negative Coggins. The CDCTS/Icon Equestrian Center release form must be filled out, signed and dated by rider and/or parent or guardian if rider is younger than 18 years old. Stallions are permitted to show at Icon Equestrian Center.

Payment in full must accompany the entry form. If payment has not been received by closing date of Tuesday May 3, 2022, the entry will be void. Payment by PayPal is also accepted. If you choose to use PayPal, make sure you scan or print a copy of your payment receipt and send it with your completed and signed show entry form so that the Show Secretary can confirm your payment.

#### Refunds:

No cash refunds *after closing date*. Show credit will be given with a veterinarian's or a doctor's certificate/letter. RETURNED CHECKS for NSF will incur a \$40.00 fee and a void entry.

#### Due Date:

Entries are due to the Show Secretary postmarked no later than May 3, 2022

## On-Grounds Schooling of Horse (non-competing horse)

Competitors who wish to take advantage of this opportunity need to provide a copy of negative coggins, pay the on-grounds fee, a bridle tag fee of \$2.00, and the office fee on or before the closing date. CDCTS and Icon Equestrian Center Hold Harmless Release must be signed as well. When the horse is on the grounds, the bridle tag must be worn at all times.

#### Awards:

Ribbons will be awarded in all classes of placements 1st through 6th place

High point ribbons and gifts will be awarded for Adult Amateur and Junior Rider

#### Arena:

All Dressage Tests will be ridden in the indoor arena. Footing is sand and GGT. Warm up area will be in a paddock and will be marked.

Dressage tests Intro, A, B, C, Western Basic & intro, Gaited, and CT dressage tests "Green As Grass," "Elementary Novice," and Preliminary Test A & B will be ridden in a 20 m x 40 m arena. All other dressage tests, including the following CT tests—Preliminary Test B and Intermediate A and B—will be ridden in a 20 m x 60 m arena.

Jumping will be in the outdoor arena with sand footing.

#### Attire:

Appropriate informal schooling attire is required. ASTM-SEI approved helmets and appropriate footwear is required and must be worn at all times when mounted. Face masks will be required if state mandates are in effect and are required for everyone, except when mounted.

## Parking:

Cars may be parked separately from trailers, depending on numbers. Trailers will be parked in an assigned area. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with parking. Please follow the guidance of the volunteers, **park only in designated areas**.

## **Ride Times:**

Official ride times will be posted on the CDCTS website and Facebook page on Thursday May 5, 2022 after 6 pm.

Day Stalls: will be available through Icon Equestrian Center at a cost of \$40 overnight or \$25 for the day

**Concessions**: Concessions will be available.

Dogs: No dogs allowed. No exceptions


