CDCTS MEETING MINUTES, APRIL 9, 2019

I. Call to order

President Jean Sullivan called to order the regular meeting of the CDCTS Board at 7 p.m. on April 9, 2019 at RJ's Courtyard, Alcoa TN.

II. Roll call

President Jean Sullivan conducted the roll call. The following Board members were present: Jean Sullivan, Ashley Phillips, Susan Hill, Carol Mitchell, Carolyn Ordal, Jill Strain, Kennetha Eikelberg, Alee Ellis and Jeannie Baggett. The following Board members were absent: none. There was a quorum. The following CDCTS members were in attendance: Caylee Baggett, Janice Butt, Julie Noe, Rita Dunn, Joey Wood, Louise Von Clef, Rosemary Jones and Susan Michaud. Visitors: Jenny Wood.

III. Approval of minutes from last meeting

Minutes from March 12, 2019 were sent electronically via newsletter to all members for their review. A motion to accept the minutes as read was submitted by Alece Ellis and seconded by Janice Butt. Carried.

IV. Committee Reports

Treasurer's Report. Jill Strain described cash flow for the month and announced the current balance of \$20,650.12, with \$52.00 in deposits and \$211.40 in expenditures. A draft budget based on last year's spending patterns was presented but will be further refined for next month's meeting. New controls on spending by committee members was introduced: to be reimbursed for expenses actual receipts for items must be presented within 30 days of purchase to the Treasurer along with the individual's name and the assigned activity. Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report by Kennetha Eikelberg, seconded by Jeannie Baggett. Approved.

- c. Show committee needs additional volunteers for the spring schooling show. Jean Sullivan is the Volunteer Coordinator. She can be reached at shamrockfarm3100@gmail.com if you are able to volunteer to support the show for any of the following positions: set up and tear down teams, jump set up, scribe, scorer, runner, ring stewards for jump ring and dressage rings, concessions. Set up will start at 5 p.m. on May 3, 2019 at Penrose Farm.

Eventing Committee. Ashley has rescheduled the "Learn to Show" clinic for April 24, 2019 at Winfield Oaks. A list of topics will be geared to attending our schooling shows and includes how to prepare for tests, what to do when you and your horse arrive, when to check in with show secretary, when to get to each ring prior to riding your test, equipment and attire and etiquette while on the show grounds.

Dressage Committee. Investigation into our club joining WE was conducted. As long as we do not display any USDF logo at WE events, we are fine to join Confederation of Working Equitation as one of its GMOs (www.confederationWE.us). Discussed. Motion to spend \$100.00 on joining the WE was proposed by Kennetha Eikelberg, seconded by Carolyn Ordal. Carried. Treasurer to send in membership application and funds to WE.

Sponsorship of competitors' dinner at Dressage by the River for \$300 was proposed by Alece Ellis and seconded by Jeannie Baggett. Approved. Carried.

Sponsorship of a Team Challenge Award at Dressage by the River was tabled for further discussion.

Membership Committee. Jill Strain has investigated costs and availability of long-sleeved shirts and polos with a local printer. There will be a range of colors, sizes available. Members will select their items on the printer's website, pay for their purchase directly with the printer via on-line payment, eliminating the need for the club to carry an inventory. Jill asks members to contact her if they would like to be part of the decision making team on various styles and logo options.

Health and Wellness Committee. Kennetha Eikelberg put out a call for new committee members and reminded all that committee members will be welcome to attend via conference call rather than physically attending, depending on individual schedules. 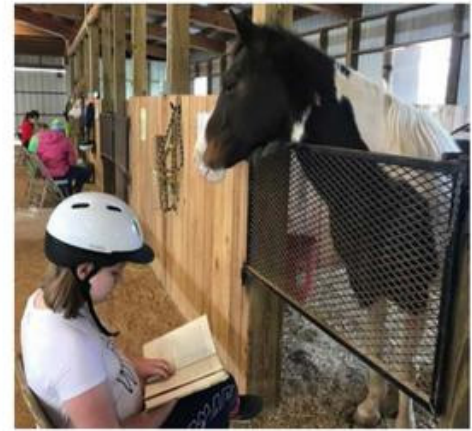

Arena:

All Dressage Tests will be ridden in the Covered outdoor arena. Footing is sand and GGT. Warm up area will be in an outdoor sand ring and will be marked.

Dressage tests Intro, A, B, C and CT dressage tests "Green As Grass," "Elementary Novice," and Preliminary Test A will be ridden in a 20 m x 40 m arena. All other dressage tests, including the following CT tests—Preliminary Test B and Intermediate A and B—will be ridden in a 20 m x 60 m arena.

Jumping will be in a fenced-in outdoor arena. Footing is sand.

Attire:

Appropriate informal schooling attire is required. ASTM-SEI approved helmets and appropriate footwear is required and must be worn at all times when mounted.

Parking:

Cars may be parked separately from trailers, depending on numbers. Trailers will be parked in a signed area. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with parking. Please follow the guidance of the volunteers, park only in designated areas.

Ride Times:

Official ride times will be posted on the CDCTS website and FaceBook page on Thursday May 2, 2019 after 6 p.m.

Day Stalls:

CDCTS SCHOOLING SHOWS: General Rules and Etiquette

General Rules

- All shows are run under the general rules of USEF, unless otherwise specified.
- Approved protective headgear and footwear with appropriate heels must be worn whenever mounted.
- All schooling shows offer current: USDF Introductory Levels, USEF Training through Fourth Level, FEI levels, Rider tests, USEA Eventing tests, Pas de Deux and Musical Freestyles (all levels).
- It is expected that riders take pride in their turnout. Coats are encouraged, but not required. Plain white riding shirts or polo-style shirts with dark breeches are also appropriate. T-shirts or tank tops are not permitted. Note: during hot weather, riders are encouraged to show without coats in the interest of their health.
- Please go to the following websites to ensure that your attire and equipment is aligned with your discipline:

- Braiding the mane is encouraged, but not required.
- The following equipment is forbidden at a dressage show: martingales of any kind; bearing, side or running reins; seat covers; and any form of blinkers.
 - The following equipment is permitted in warm-up areas: running martingales, bandages, boots and side reins.
 - All equipment, including whips, bits and spurs must comply with USEF rules.
 - Ear nets are permitted; fly masks are not allowed.
- No bareback riding is allowed.
- A rider should not be judged by anyone who has instructed him/her within the last 30 days (exception: attending clinics). If you arrive at the show and find that your instructor has been substituted for the judge, notify the show manager and ask to ride hors concours, or don't ride and receive a full credit for your entry fees.
- If you are riding a musical freestyle, please bring your own music and boom box.
- Check your score before you leave the show grounds. Any scoring errors must be reported and corrected before you leave the show grounds. After that time, no corrections can be made.
- Please note that classes do not always go in order of lowest to highest. Classes at shows may be scheduled in any order throughout the day.
- Classes may be split or combined, depending on the number and distribution of entries.
- If you intend to bring a horse that is not competing onto the show grounds, this decision must be cleared with the show manager prior to the show date, and will be at his/her discretion. If permitted by the manager, you must bring a current negative Coggins test to the show grounds and present it to the manager upon your arrival, before you unload your horse and also pay the non-competition fee. Please see the entry form for details.

CDCTS SCHOOLING SHOWS - continued

Show Etiquette

- Be considerate of other riders in the warm-up area. Pass left-shoulder to left-shoulder and yield to those who are moving at faster gaits.
- Arrive outside the ring approximately one minute before your ride time, having already warmed up your horse. You will have 45 seconds to enter the ring once the judge has rung the bell.
- If your ride is not next, please do not congregate with your horse around the arena entrance.
- Lunging is prohibited in the warm-up area; check with the show manager or warm-up ring steward about where lunging is permitted on the show grounds.
- Be courteous to the judge and show volunteers.
- Should you need to excuse yourself from the ring during your test for any reason, be sure to ask for the judge's permission prior to exiting the ring.
- Leave your trailer site clean; pick up all trash and manure and dispose of it or take it with you.
- Obey all rules of the facility where the show is held. (For example: where to park, no smoking, no dogs, etc)

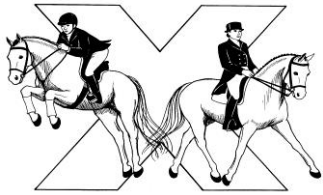
