

But as they develop an understanding of the alphabetic principle, children begin to process letters, translate them into sounds, and connect this information with a known meaning. Although it may seem as though some children acquire these understandings magically or on their own, studies suggest that they are the beneficiaries of considerable, though playful and informal, adult guidance and instruction (Durkin 1966; Anbar 1986)

Dear Storybook Village Preschool Families,

Zoo-phonics teaches the sequence of learning according to the natural development of the child: listening first, and then speaking, reading and writing. Zoo-phonics uses the language that the child has already developed, and connects it to the sounds of the alphabet.

This is how Storybook Village Preschool supports each child's language and literacy development by providing a continuity of learning experience from infancy to preschool!

Infants: Listening & Babbling Stage! Singing and memicing sounds with board books and meaningful interactions.

Toddlers: Speaking Stage! Memorizing nursery rhymes and simple poems with Sensory Singing Baskets and Music & Movement. The "language explosion" time is exciting for adults to see first hand how language is developed and how each child learns.

Preschoolers: Reading & Writing Stage!

- 1. We teach the Shapes and Sounds of the Alphabet through the Animal Pictures and Body Signals. We have a "Sound of the Week" to allow time for mastery.
- 2. We read aloud stories to the children. Through this, they develop basic concepts of print such as directionality, one-to-one correspondence of sounds to words, and relating speech to reading.
- 3. We promote cognitive and critical thinking skills through reading aloud and oral language experiences.

It won't be long before your child will actually be reading and spelling small but important words!
