December 2023 meeting of the Worlebury Preceptory, E.Kt. Phil Summers was conferred with Honorary membership.

Phil became a Knight of the Temple on 3rd May 1995 and Eminent Preceptor in 2003 and 2004. He

was then appointed to PrStdB(B) in 2005, and to PPrChanc. in 2012; whilst attaining Great Priory Rank of P.Gt.Chamb. in 2011.

Phil, now 96 years of age, was until recently the Preceptory's Treasurer a position he held for many years, a much-valued member of the Preceptory.



On Monday 15th January, 57 Knights including the Provincial Prior and Provincial Sub-Prior attended the Keynsham Masonic Hall, when three Knights (two from King Arthur of Avalon Preceptory and one from Worlebury Preceptory) were installed as Knights of Malta.

The meeting was conducted superbly by the Eminent Prior, E.Kt. Garry Mackenzie, supported by the officers of the Keynsham Priory, with the Knights of the Provincial Prior's Bodyguard acting as the Banner Guards. The Provincial Prior conferred the Accolades and demonstrated the sign whilst the address was given by E.Kt. John Creech E.Kt.Adrian Jones and E.Kt Bill Whitehead.

It was splendid to see so many Knights gathered together on a cold night in January with the majority wearing the full regalia of a Knight of Malta which added to the superb atmosphere of the occasion.

On completion of the Ceremony the Knights attended a wonderful After Meeting. This being the month of celebrating Robert Burns, the first course was Haggis accompanied by Neeps and Tatties and a wee dram; and the main course was the famous, Keynsham Hot Buffet! which everyone thoroughly enjoyed.

A SMALL PIECE OF HISTORY

BLADUD 1852 TO

According to ancient legend, the origin of the City of Bath goes back to about 860 B.C. when Prince Bladud, son of Hub Hubris, King of Britain, caught leprosy whilst on a visit to Greece; was banished from the royal court, and obtained employment as a swineherd. His pigs suffered from a skin disease but were cured after wallowing in pools of warm mud. The Prince followed them in and he, too, was eventually cured. He returned to court and, after becoming King, founded, a settlement on the site of the healing pool.

Such is the generally accepted form of the legend, although readers of Dickens will be aware of a somewhat more fanciful alternative to be found in Pickwick Papers.

In any event, the Prince gave his name to the Encampment consecrated on the 19th November 1852. The ceremony of consecration was conducted by the Provincial Grand Commander for Staffordshire, Sir Knight G. Vernon. It is noted, however, that Col. Charles Kerneys Kerneys Tynte was at this time the Provincial Grand Commander of the Provincial Grand Conclave of Somersetshire.

The Preceptory which, during its long and distinguished history has numbered amongst its members three Brother Knights who have served the Province either as Provincial Grand Commander or as Provincial Prior, celebrated its centenary meeting on 26th March 1953, when a "short account of extracts from the minutes of the last 100 years" was presented. Subsequently, the Preceptory received its centenary warrant from the Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master, The Right Honourable Lord Harris at the meeting of Provincial Priory on 1st July 1953, when the present Province of Somerset was inaugurated.

The Preceptory banner, which depicts the Prince, was dedicated by the R.E. David Palmer the Provincial Prior for Somerset at the meeting held on 25th February 1988.

very distinguished Freemason and his contribution to our Province was enormous.



AN INTERESTING (EXTRA) SNIPPET

Did you know our that our Provincial Prior spent his working life at the sharp end of the Criminal Justice Arena?


A Police Officer in Bristol, a Detective in Bermuda and then a Probation Officer in Avon & Somerset (in his latter years he was seconded to The Ministry of Justice and a Specialist Police Unit in London). An interesting life, where he gained expertise, in risk management, working directly with High Risk and Dangerous Offenders, consequently this led him to spend a few years 'behind bars' in Prisons.

As part of The Senior Management Team in HMP Shepton Mallet (Cat D/Lifer Prison) he expanded links with the local Community and was pivotal in ensuring one particular project was taken forward.

In December last year, Chris and I paid a visit to Shepton Mallet Prison, whilst looking around a Funeral Bier, which I thought had been used in the prison, it wasn't until I started to read the information sheet, when I saw the name Paul Davis, and a councillor Carole Robinson on the sheet, so I put two and two together and realised this was Paul was our own Provincial Prior, and Carole his wife.

It is clear that the project to repair the bier was too good to miss for the prisoners in the workshop. The bier was brought to the prison in a number of boxes, having been dismantled and basically left to rot for years. The prisoners did a good job, although if you knew their crimes, it was somewhat ironic. The write up on the Bier and photo of it is below.

Although no longer a Prison the historical buildings are open to the public and well worth a visit.
