Listen, Confirm, Act, Ready for lifestyle changes

Pray again, at least daily

Matthew

- Matthew 2:12-13, "And it was made clear to them by God in a dream that they were not to go back to Herod; so they went into their country by another way. And when they had gone, an angel of the Lord came to Joseph in a dream, saying, Get up and take the young child and his mother, and go into Egypt, and do not go from there till I give you word; for Herod will be searching for the young child to put him to death"
- Matthew 3:8, "Produce fruit that is consistent with repentance."
- Matthew 5:21-22, "Thou shall not kill includes not even hating."
- **Matthew 5:23-24,** "If you are presenting an offering ...and remember your brother has something against you, leave the offering and reconcile yourself with your brother, then come back and present the offering"
- Matthew 5:27-28, "Thou shall not commit adultery, stops it at its source, the heart."
- Matthew 6:6, "when you pray, go into your room (alone), shut the door and pray to your Father in secret."
- Matthew 6:7, "when you pray, don't say meaningless things...your father knows what you need before you ask him."

Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything that you have given me is from you. For I have given them the words that you gave me, and they have received them and have come to know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are vours. All mine are vours, and vours are mine, and I am glorified in them. And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves, have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth. I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you. Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."
- Luke 18:1, "men ought always to pray, and not to faint."
- Luke 18:13, "But the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote his breast, saying, God, be thou merciful to me a sinner. I say unto you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalts himself shall be humbled."

Romans

- Romans 1:17, "...The righteous shall live by faith."
- Romans 1:18-32, "God's Wrath on Unrighteousness For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Claiming to be wise, they became fools, and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things. Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves, because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen. NOT ESV
- **Romans 5:1-2**, "Being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ; through whom we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand"
- Romans 11:26-32, " For this reason God gave them up to dishonorable passions. For their women exchanged natural relations for those that are contrary to nature; and the men likewise gave up natural relations with women and were consumed with passion for one another, men committing shameless acts with men and receiving in themselves the due penalty for their error. And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done. They were filled with all manner of unrighteousness, evil, covetousness, malice. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, maliciousness. They are gossips, slanderers, haters of God, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, 31 foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. 32 Though they know God's righteous decree that those who practice such things deserve to die, they not only do them but give approval to those who practice them."
- Romans 4:17-24, "Abraham acted in faith when he stood in the presence of God, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence things that don't yet exist. Hoping in spite of hopeless circumstances, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," just as he had been told: "This is how many descendants you will have." His faith did not weaken when he thought about his own body (which was already a as good as dead now that he was about a hundred years old) or about Sarah's inability to have children, nor did he doubt God's promise out of a lack of faith. Instead, his faith became stronger and he gave glory to God, being absolutely convinced that God would do what he had promised. This is why "it was credited to him as righteousness." Now the words "it was credited to him" were written not only for him but also for us. Our faith will be regarded in the same way, a if we believe in the one who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead."
- **Romans 5:1-2**, "Being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ; through whom we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand."
- **Romans 6:1-12**, "baptism signifies a symbolic dying to sin and the resurrection to a new life and reception of the Holy Spirit."
- Romans 6:11-13, "see yourselves as dead to sin, but living to God in Christ Jesus. For this cause do not let sin be ruling in your body which is under the power of death, so that you give way to its desires; And do not give your bodies to sin as the instruments of wrongdoing, but give yourselves to God, becoming "clean & holy" before God, because "He is Holy", so He can accept your prayers, and answer them, to make you holy."
- Romans 8:26, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. 27 And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. 28 And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good."
- **Romans 10:8-10**, When you believe something you have confidence in it and are willing to trust it. This trust leads you to begin to act in accordance with what he believes, and the result is obedience

to it, when repeated often enough, results in faith. "The word is near you, even in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

- Romans 10:12-13, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."
- Romans 10:14-21, "How are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? How are they to hear without someone preaching? How are they to preach unless they are sent? How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news! faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."
- Romans 12:12, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer."
- Romans 15:5-6, "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- **Romans 15:13,** "Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy ghost."

1 Corinthians

Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us for it is written, Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree so that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promised Spirit through faith."
- Galatians 5:19-21, "Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you. .. those who practice these will not inherit the kingdom of God."

Ephesians

- **Ephesians 2:10,** "the Father created us for good works, He prearranged for us to perform." How can a person with a dead faith that produces no works, be in God's Kingdom, since he would be failing to do the very thing for which God is creating him in Christ?"
- Ephesians 2:18, "For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father."

Trust & Obey = Faith

Romans 10:8-10, When you believe something and have confidence that it is trust it. This confidence leads you to begin to act in accordance with what he believes, and the result is obedience to it, when repeated often enough, results in faith. "The word is near you, even in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one *believes to righteousness*, and with the mouth confession is made to salvation.

Isaiah 59:1-2, "Behold, the LORD's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; nor His ear heavy, that it cannot hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God; and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear." (166)

How to Prepare for prayer:

- 1) **Alone** Jesus made this the first requirement. When you pray you are communicating with the God of the Universe. He wants your full attention, so go where you won't be distracted. When you pray in a group, focus on who you are talking to, and what you are asking for.
- Forgiving God can't forgive you if you are holding a grudge against someone who has wronged you, or if someone else has a reason to hold one against you for you wronging them. Seek forgiveness and give it before praying.
- 3) **Confess** not remorse over the sin in your life, but actual change stop sinning by loving your neighbor with your words and actions, and
- 4) Trust Believe Faith. If you don't believe God is listening, can fulfill your request, loves you enough to do it, and to protect you from temptation and give you the strength to fulfill His will, don't ask.
- 5) **Format an answerable, brief petition aligned with God's will;** preferably a yes/no, because observable answers build faith in you and those around you it is your duty to share it with.
- 6) The Lord's Prayer format: Honor/Thanks/Petition
- 7) Keep it short. God already knows what you need. All he wants to know is your heart on the matter. He doesn't need suggestions on how to fix it, but he wants you to ask Him to. Again, only what you have faith he will do. No faith, no answer.
- 8) Listen. You may get your answer immediately, through the Spirit, a voice, a dream, a call, who knows. You may get the answer a year later. Have faith He heard the prayer and will respond, if you have met all the criteria above. If not, fix it and pray again. Forgive that person, study your bible for God's general will on the problem at hand, quit the sin standing between you and God.
- 9) **Pray daily. Jesus did.** Set aside the time and energy. Meditate on God all day, to keep his commandments fresh before you and to feed your faith. Maybe the sin closing God's ears to your prayers will be revealed. Be ready for it.
