

Nuttall Oak

Quercus nuttalli



Excellent tree for mass plantings where highly predictable and consistent forms are needed. Will grow in soils not normally associated with the red oak group – rather moist, heavy clay conditions. Relatively pest free. *Very similar tree to the pin oak.* Outstanding shade tree, good fall color-ranging from yellow to red depending on the weather that year, long-lived, tolerant of soil extremes, acorns for wildlife. Oval to rounded canopy. Upper branches ascending, lower branches horizontal. Found in eastern Texas, eastward to Alabama and north to Oklahoma, Arkansas and Missouri. 100'x40' average. Deciduous.
