Thoughts from the Preparedness Corner

Thoughts of preparing for times of emergency or hardship often focus on the subject of food and water supplies. There is so much more to consider when planning supplies for emergencies than just these items. Emergency storage and supplies need to reflect the uniqueness of your situation and family. In your supplies are there items to help keep kids entertained and occupied? Do you have a supply of toothpaste or deodorant?

Do you have a supply of needed medicines such as Tylenol Advil, Motrin, cough medications, allergy meds, and others? Are you able to obtain a supply of prescription medications that are taken daily? Are any of the important daily items included in your 72-hour bags?

Another good question to ask yourself is: do you know how to use your long term supply food items? Are you aware of expiration dates and what items that can be safely used after expiration?

During the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, there was a lot of panic buying of food items, cleaning supplies, and yes, interestingly enough, toilet paper. People were buying anything and everything they could get their hands on. It made me wonder if some of those buying the multiple packets of yeast and flour understood how to store it properly and just how short of a shelf life some of our modern reiterations of staple items have.

Do you know where your water meter is located?

The Ashton City Water Department is asking for home and business owners to take a moment to find where there water meter is located. Please make sure that there are no heavy items, vehicles, or large piles of trash, placed or parked on top of the water meters.

Please also make sure that the water meter is accessible.

Please DO NOT Flush wipes!!

Please do not flush wipes, sanitary items, napkins or other materials other than toilet paper.

Our sewer system is designed for toilet paper and the many other items that are being flushed down toilets are creating costly issues with the system.

Tastes of Spring

Springtime Beignets & Berries

TOTAL TIME: Prep: 25 min. + chilling Cook: 25 min. YIELD: 4 dozen.

Ingredients

1/4 cup butter, room temperature

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons warm water (120° to 130°), divided

1/2 cup evaporated milk

1 package (1/4 ounce) quick-rise yeast

1 large egg

3-1/4 to 3-3/4 cups all-purpose flour

Oil for deep-fat frying

Confectioners' sugar



- 1. Beat butter, sugar, salt and cinnamon until crumbly. Beat in 1/2 cup water and evaporated milk. In another bowl, dissolve yeast in remaining 2 tablespoons water; add to milk mixture. Beat in egg until blended.
- 2. Add 2 cups flour; mix until well blended. Stir in enough remaining flour to form a soft dough (dough will be sticky). Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover; refrigerate 4 hours or overnight.
- 3. Bring dough to room temperature. On a floured surface, roll dough into a 16x12-in. rectangle. Cut into 2-in. squares. In a deep cast-iron skillet or deep- fat fryer, heat oil to 375°. Drop beignets, a few at a time, into hot oil. Fry until golden brown, about 1 minute per side. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar. If desired, serve with assorted berries and whipped topping.
