2024 Olympia Dog Days Farm Dog Trial (Sheep)

General Rules: Time limit: 25 minutes - warning at 10 and 3 minutes. Time starts: When the dog is sent on the outrun. Ties are broken based on individual scores in the following order: Exercise 1 Gather, Exercise #7 Gate Sort. All gates must be closed and secured before moving on to the next task. <u>Dog must hold sheep off gates</u>.

Set up: Course is set with five sheep in sort yard pens A or D and five sheep set out for the gather. All gates are shut and latched. All drop gates are down. A set out dog may be used.

- 1. Gather150' 20 points(Location Specific) (Differentiation)
 - Gather sheep and move them clockwise around Cone 1. This task ends when all sheep have passed the backside of Cone 1, clockwise.
 - Advanced must stay at the cone
 - **Open**must leave dog at the cone. Handler can move halfway to sheep to send.
- 2. Pen 1–6 points
 - Take sheep into Pen 1 then move them into Pen 2.Task ends when the gate to Pen 2 is closed.
- 3. Pen 2- 6 points
 - Move sheep through Pen 2 into the Crowding Alley. Task ends when gate to the Crowding Alley is closed.
- 4. Chute 20 points
 - Load sheep into the Chute.Put ribbons on four sheep.
 - Release all sheep into the exit pen on the right.
 - Remove all sheep from the exit pen without the dog or handler entering the pen. Place dog to the side so the sheep will exit. Task ends when all sheep are in Big Arena and the exit pen gate is closed.
- 5. **Drive**150' **20 points**(Differentiation)
 - Move sheep to Cone 1.
 - Drive sheep to Cone 2.Task ends once all sheep have passed Cone 2.
 - $\circ\,\textbf{Advanced}$ must drive the entire distance.
 - Openmust drive at least halfway to Cone 2 then may walk with the sheep.
- 6. Hold / Ribbon Pull 20 points (Location Specific) (Differentiation)
 - Hold sheep in the vicinity of Cone 2.
 - o Advanced handlers must pull the ribbon off of one sheep after the judge calls the hold.
 - **Open handlers**, hold only.
 - This task ends when the judge calls the hold (open) or when a ribbon is successfully pulled (advanced).
- 7. Gate Sort 25 points (Differentiation)
 - Move sheep into Test Arena, then into the Sort Yard.
 - Do a gate sort into either Pen A or Pen D, whichever does not already have sheep in it.
 - Advanced handlers, sort the three ribboned sheep into the pen. Close gate. Put the rest of the sheep in the pen. This task ends when all five sheep are in the pen.
 - **Open handlers**, sort three of the four ribboned sheep into the pen. Close gate. Then put the remainder of the sheep into the pen. This task ends when all five sheep are in the pen.
- 8. Pen 3 6 points
 - Take the sheep out of the other sort yard pen.
 - Move them out of the sort yard and into Pen 4. Once the sort yard gate is closed this task is complete.
- 9. Pen 4 7 points
 - Take the sheep through Pen 4 and put them into the junkyard across from the sort yard.
 - Task is complete and time ends once the gate to the junkyard is closed with all sheep inside.
