

From the log of W7PD, Stan. ARRL has come up with a handy little gadget for locating Oscar 7. It is called an "OSCARLOCATOR"!, and sells for \$1.00, Postpaid, Newington, CT. Using this device in conjunction with orbital data from AMSAT, 73 Mag., or W1AW bulletins, one can easily determine when either "bird" will be within range of Sun City. It is especially useful in determining the paths of descending orbits, a procedure somewhat involved if one depends solely upon mathmatical calculations.
