1. Call to Order, Roll Call and Opening Comments

Board Vice Chair Val Gale, representing the City of Chandler, called the meeting of the Regional Wireless Cooperative (RWC) Board of Directors (Board) to order at 10:04 AM. Vice Chair Gale asked RWC Management Assistant, Nick Roosevelt (RWC) to take Roll Call.

2. Call to the Public

Vice Chair Gale asked if there were any requests from the public to speak. Selena Barner (RWC) replied that no requests were submitted.

3. Approval of RWC Board Meeting Minutes from the September 7, 2023, Meeting

Vice Chair Gale asked the Board if there was any need for discussion on the draft minutes presented from the September 7, 2023, Board Meeting. There was no discussion.

A <u>MOTION</u> was made by Paul Luizzi and <u>SECONDED</u> by Rick St. John to approve the September 7, 2023, RWC Board meeting minutes.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY (17-0)

4. Financial Update for Fiscal Year 2022/23 and Settlement Credit

Almira Santos (RWC) presented a report on the financial update and settlement from fiscal year 2022/23. There were savings due to Trunked/VHF Network contingency funds, vacant positions within the IT Services Department, the training/equipment costs that was not utilized and other areas. She noted that revenues exceeded expenses by around \$1,041,874.33 and she discussed some of the reasons for that variance. The report included the amount due to each Member once approved by the Board.

A <u>MOTION</u> was made by Alan Zangle and <u>SECONDED</u> by Paul Luizzi to approve the recommendation as presented.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY (18-0)

Board Chair Andrea Glass (Representing the City of Tempe) arrived, raising the quorum from 17 to 18 members. Chair Glass instructed Vice Chair Gale to continue conducting the meeting.



5. <u>RWC Trunked Network Fiscal Year 2024/25 Subscriber Unit Rate, FY 25 Budget Overview</u> and 5-Year Plan

Ms. Santos (RWC) presented the proposed subscriber unit rate, budget overview and 5-year plan for fiscal year 2024/25. She mentioned that the projected rate, if approved, will be \$34.06, which represents a \$0.53 decrease from the current rate of \$34.59. The rate was based on the October 2023 Radio count and the report included a projection for FY25 and the four following years including a breakdown for each member.

A **MOTION** was made by Rick St. John and **SECONDED** by Steen Hambric to approve the recommendation as presented.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY (18-0)

6. <u>RWC Conventional (VHF) Network Fiscal Year 2024/25 Subscriber Unit Rate, FY 25</u> Budget Overview and 5-Year Plan

Ms. Santos presented the proposed subscriber unit rate, budget overview and 5-year plan for fiscal year 2024/25. She mentioned that the projected rate, if approved, will be \$9.82, which represents a \$0.63 increase from the current rate of \$9.19. She mentioned that this was due to a 36% increase in Telecommunication costs. The rate was based on the October 2023 Radio count and the report included a projection for FY25 and the four following years including a breakdown for each member.

A <u>MOTION</u> was made by Paul Luizzi and <u>SECONDED</u> by Alan Zangle to approve the recommendation as presented.

7. Executive Director's Report

A. RWC External Audit Update

Mr. Imig stated that the external audit is near completion and a full report, along with the Annual Financial Report, will be given during the February 2024 RWC Board Meeting.

B. Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Proposal

Mr. Imig shared that a third UASI Grant Proposal was submitted and if granted, it will be used to cover the cost of a virtual secondary corps and equipment.

C. T1 to Ethernet Network Upgrade

Mr. Imig updated the committee on the T1 to Ethernet Upgrade status and the importance of transitioning to an Ethernet based network.



D. Project Updates

Mr. Imig gave a brief update on multiple projects and mentioned that they have several meetings in place to discuss solutions to deal with continued coverage issues in certain areas.

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022/23 financial updates to the RWC Board of Directors.

THE ISSUE

RWC Governance requires that year-end expenditure reports be provided to the RWC Board of Directors. This report is a summary of the total revenues and expenses for FY 2022/23. Total revenues collected for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2023, were \$9,060,434, with total actual operations and maintenance (O&M) expenditures totaling \$8,092,462. Total revenues exceeded total expenses for RWC Members by \$967,972. After adding interest earned for FY 23 of \$73,902, this results in Settlement Credits totaling \$1,041,874, which will go back to the Members.

Variances in the RWC budget to actual expenses occurred in the following areas:

- Contingency Fund was not utilized.
- Salary savings from one (1) vacant position within the radio shop. This vacancy, combined
 with other additional savings such as lower electricity charges and a reduction in
 miscellaneous maintenance charges, resulted in lower than expected charges.

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present the FY 2024/25 Subscriber Unit Rate, FY 25 Budget Overview and 5-Year Plan for the RWC Trunked Network.

THE ISSUE

The Subscriber Unit Rate is determined by dividing the staffing, operations, and maintenance budget by the number of subscriber units estimated to be on the network in FY 2024/25. The rate for FY 2024/25, if approved, will be \$34.06, which represents a decrease of \$0.53 from the previous rate of \$34.59. This revised rate was based on the October 2023 Radio count. The reasons for the rate decrease are as follows:

- A 3% increase in the radio count lowered the per unit O&M cost
- Tower space lease (Cashion Site) from Crown Castle ended in FY 23
