Conservation Notes - Bob Laubengayer And "Save The Bay"

Toxic Runoff from Central Valley Agribusiness to Continue Polluting Bay Waters

In the first major act of environmental policy by the Schwarzenegger administration, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) voted Jan. 22, to extend for another 5 years a waiver that exempts the agricultural industry from standard toxic discharge requirements that protect the region's waterways and the health of San Francisco Bay. The agricultural waiver is issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) and has been in effect for more than 20 years, resulting in widespread degradation of California's waterways and San Francisco Bay. It allows the agricultural industry to regularly discharge toxic pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers, which are washed every time it rains into more than 600 miles of Central Valley creeks, streams and rivers that lead into the Bay. Polluted runoff from Central Valley agribusiness is currently one of the largest sources of water pollution in the Bay

Governor Schwarzenegger Appoints Loris "Ryan" Brodrick Director of the Department of Fish & Game

Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger announced today the appointment of Loris "Ryan" Brodrick to the position of Director of the Department of Fish and Game.

"Ryan's extensive background in conservation and resource management makes him an ideal candidate to lead the Department of Fish and Game," said Schwarzenegger. "During his long time service, Ryan has proven his ability to work with many diverse interests in the service of protecting California's wildlife resources."

Brodrick has worked in the Department of Fish and Game for over 20 years, beginning in 1981 as a game warden and holding a variety of positions before being appointed Chief Deputy Director in 1997. He left the department in 2001 to join the Western Regional Office of Ducks Unlimited.
