Quiltfest- More quilts needed for this event. Deadline is extended to the 31 of March. Publicity reported putting an ad in the Pocono Record. Sew and Vac, American Ribbon, and Quilterie are setting up an area with business cards and info. Quilt drop off will be on March 31 at the Library. Kathy Parrish will take quilts then. Sleeves aren't needed on big quilts. Set-up should be easy. As quilts come in they will be draped over the pew. There are no vendors. Peggy and Lorraine are in charge of consignment if you have any questions ask them. In Quilter's Boutique -10% of what is sold goes back to the guild. In the Children's Corner will be quilt stories, and coloring pages. Kathleen Hahn and Sarah Pierson will be at the Admission table.

Quilt Bingo- Please start selling tickets for Bingo. Make a flyer printing a promotion to join the guild for new members- it will be free rest of the year and pay for new year 2018-2019. Five people signed up for Live demos. Members who have a personal business quilt related may have flyers or business cards. Food will be taken care of by church youth group. Try to park our cars further away on the day of Quiltfest since there is limited parking.

Quilts need to be delivered to the church between 3:00 and 5:00 PM. Quilts should be brought to the side entrance of the church. Please try to deliver your quilts as early as possible, without the quilts we cannot set up. There will be volunteers to help carry quilts from cars into the church if you need assistance. During set up there will be very little heavy lifting or climbing on ladders. We should not be there very late and we will have pizza for those helping.

Take down on Saturday the 14<sup>th</sup> will start right after the show ends at 3:00pm. Members need to either be present to pick up their quilts or make arrangements with someone from guild to get their quilts for them. Take down should be fairly quick and I anticipate being finished no later than 5:00 pm.

# **Charity Quilts**

Laura Lyman, Kathy Parrish, Ann Wingert, Sarah Pierson, Dnna Faulstick, and Judy Mehl attended the March 27 Charity Quilting Meeting and worked on new quilts. Quilt kits are still available for anyone interested. We also have 55 placemat kits available. These may be sewed at Charity Quilting sessions, or requested at board meetings.

#### PENN ROSE QUILT GUILD – QUILTER'S BUFFET

The PRQG will be hosting its 2<sup>nd</sup> Quilter's Buffet on Saturday, May 19, 2018, at the Schoeneck Moravian Church, 316 North Broad Street Ext., Nazareth, PA 18064. Time is 8:45am – 3:00pm. This is a "Round Robin" of instruction for quilters and quilter "wannabes". It's a great way to learn a new technique or to learn tips that may improve one's skills. Six 'mini seminars' are offered and attendees select four to rotate through 50 minutes of instruction and discussion (hand appliqué, hand quilting, hand embroidery, mock hand appliqué by machine, quilting with rulers on domestic machine, and English paper piecing with fussy cutting). Breakfast snacks and buffet lunch are included for a fee of \$45. Three area vendors will be set up for shopping and door prizes will be awarded.
