Activities

Quilts of Valor Quilts

Thanks to Donna Conto for making several Quilt of Valor blocks for the next Stars and Crowns quilt. Also, Kathy Parrish, Sarah Pierson and Peggy Plasencia- Chiniewicz for working on blocks at Charity quilting and Quilters Fellowship Day.

Laura will have kits at meetings if anyone else would like to make blocks to finish up the last few Quilts of Valor.

Christmas Quilt Fabric Exchange

Members who signed up to be a part of this exchange were given a list of instructions on what they had to cut at the last meeting. If you were not at the meeting, the directions were sent to you via regular mail. The pieces you are cutting to make the scrap quilt are the darker colors of a mixture of red or green, please use traditional Christmas greens and reds. Please make sure your fabrics are 100% cotton and prewashed before cutting. The number of pieces you cut can be cut from scrap fabric of red and greens, not necessarily cut from yardage of a few fabrics. It matters that you have the right number of pieces.

The Quilt Line 4 MAY 2018

Place the 63, 3 1.2' x 6 1/2" rectangles into one zip lock bag and the 42, 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" squares into another zip lock bag, put your name on both bags of fabric. Give them to Lorraine Hare, these are due at the July meeting. Please remember this is a commitment and it will only be successful if everyone who signed up does participate. Your pieces will be returned to you at the August meeting. Submitted by Lorraine Hare

"Great Big Bag Workshop" Supplies Needed:

1 1/2 yards outer bag fabric (44" wide)
1 1/4 yards lining fabric (44" wide)
1/2 yard of 3/4" elastic
Approximately 3 yards 1/4" twill tape (any color), you can also use grosgrain ribbon
Batting (about 15" x 36", polyester works best)
Thread to match fabrics
Sewing Machine
Sewing Supplies
