#### Minutes for April 17, 2019 PMQG meeting

The monthly meeting was called to order by Kathy Parrish with 23 members in attendance.

Shirley Correll moved we accept the Treasurers report, seconded by Anna Riviera, motion was carried. Kathy Parrish showed samples of a possible shirt being made for our 30th Anniversary celebration. After much discussion and changes to some of the possible logos, more will be brought up at the May meeting and vote on whether or not they will be made.

Charity quilts- Having baby quilts on hand it was discussed about what to do with them. Angels Closet will be approached and a possibility of selling them at the Quilt Bingo was suggested. # **For Your Information**



If you are interested in purchasing a guild t shirt to commemorate the 30th anniversary of our guild, you will have sign up and pay for the shirt by May 31st. The shirts will be given out at the June meeting. You may pay by check or cash. The actual cost of the shirt will depend on how many people want to buy shirts. If we only have a few members who want shirts, then the cost would be \$18.99 a shirt up to XL. There is an up charge for shirts 2XL and bigger. It is dependent on the size. The more shirts we buy the more the price decreases.

The volume pricing at 10 colored shirts is \$16.75 each. The volume pricing at 30 colored shirts is \$13.87 each.

We are offering four color choices for the shirts: Ash Grey, Vegas Gold, Pistachio and Orchid. The shirts are made by Gildan. You will choose your color and size at the meeting, I hope to have samples of the sizes.

#### Fabric Exchange

It is not too late to sign up! You can sign up to participate until the June 14th. The fabric squares will be exchanged at the August meeting. You will have to cut 60 five inch squares. To be able to cut 30 5" squares you will need 5/8 of a yard of fabric. The squares do not to be cut from all the same fabric, it is fine to use your scraps. There are many designs using 5" squares. After the first list went out, it showed some members were interested in a few colors, so we have decided to offer two groups at this time. A group for Black/Red and a group for Yellow/Blue, (the yellow will be a sunshine yellow and the blue a delft blue, do not use light blues or navy). You may sign up for both groups if you would like. The sign up sheet will be available at this meeting.
