# **Minutes**

#### Business Meeting - October 14, 2020

16 members present via Zoom

Tonight, was an experiment to see if the members would be interested in conducting Zoom meetings for our guild during the CoVid crisis. This would be a way to connect our members during social distancing recommendations. Other quilt guilds are using this forum with success. If there is interest then we can even consider hosting guest speakers. Several members voiced their experiences with using the internet via Zoom platform to participate in workshops and classes by well know speakers. There was discussion as to how many of our members have the ability to participate in Zoom or interest. It is important to remember that not all members attended regular in person meetings. The winter months also impact in person meetings due to weather and early darkness.

Discussion was held about sending an online survey to all members on key specific issues to get their feedback. Colonial Quilters recently held a meeting with a guest speaker who charged a nominal rate to see how it was received by the members. Most speakers are still charging their normal rates even though it is virtual. There would not be the extra costs of paying for their travel. It does open up the possibility of speakers from around the world.

The survey could include items such as interest in a Christmas Party or challenge reveal. Get together could possibly be held at fire hall, evening, daytime or weekend. There was discussion about safety of members gathering in person especially around the holidays. Other important issues to include on the survey would be in regards to the elections of officers which did not occur this July due to CoVid. Several officers have agreed to extend their term- Vicki- president, Ann Marie- Financial secretary, Ann-Treasurer, and Donna Conto- Secretary. Kathy has volunteered to be VP. Shirley does not want to continue as the VP. There is nothing in the By-Laws that address CoVid issues. We should just accept that people stay in office. We should put this in the survey to get feedback from the members. If there is anyone who indicated they would like to run for a position on the board then we could have an election. Lorraine will send out the survey. Most important question is do members want to continue with monthly Zoom meetings. We are limited to 10 question on this survey format. The Board did make the decision to not have any dues this year. There was a question raised about paying for quest speakers with no income. We did not have any speakers since March even though we had some scheduled. We do not know how long the CoVid restrictions will be in place. The guild has \$11,000. Lorraine and Vicki will work together to make the survey questions.

There was discussion about other guilds and the activities they are having. Most are only doing online activities via Zoom but there are some groups meeting outside. The Board is concerned about us losing members with inactivity. If we have a guest speaker on line via Zoom we can control non member access. The cost for a Zoom membership is about \$15 a month. Motion was made by Marie Schriever for the guild to begin a Zoom membership. Seconded by Kathleen McCarthy. All were in favor. There was discussion about possible in person gathering. Cannot use library. Possibly use Firehall. Could have those who did the challenge show their projects. Need to know how many members would be interested. Discussed possible activities we can do on Zoom. Mystery quilts, Block of the Month and

Show and Tell. Charity quilts has kits and has organizations who will take them. Nursing homes, C&Y, Women's resources, Hospice will all take quilts. Meals on Wheels will accept placemats. Kathy said she can arrange for delivery and pickup. Laura Lyman said she would put together power point presentation of show and tell.

There was discussion about making a contribution to organizations as we have in the past during our Christmas meeting. We could just use a dollar amount from past donations. Last year we donated \$500 to two organizations. We could make a motion at the next Zoom meeting.

Kathleen McCarty informed all present about the donation she received from Warm Batting Company. She was looking for information of available batting for her own use and the company offered her swatch cards and batting. She received 10 different sizes and types of batting as well as 50 swatch cards. She is willing to help distribute to members. Vicki will send a thankyou from the guild to the company. We could use batting as a raffle to members to encourage participation in meetings.

Members present did a virtual show and tell. A motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Marie Schriever and seconded by Ann Wingert. All approved.

#### **Free Sample Cards:**

Kathleen McCarthy had been in contact with the Warm and Natural batting company who sent her 30 sample cards with batting swatches. They also donated a number of packages of batting which we can use for Quilts of Valor, charity quilts and as we wish. We will be at the Hughes Library Saturday November 21 from 11-2 in the parking lot across from the Walgreens. Please stop by and pick up your sample card.

#### **November Ornament:**

In a normal world we would make an ornament as our November Program. Instead I have picked two paper pieced ornaments and I am challenging everyone to make one or two, embellish them and show them at our December meeting. There are samples of the ones I made on the website. I have included some hints for making paper pieced blocks. Have fun and stretched your creative imagination. I am looking forward to seeing the variety of ornaments

#### Tips for paper piecing:

Small stitches are important. I use 1.8mm. This makes it easier to remove the paper.

Cut your fabric at least 1" larger than the area you are trying to cover. It does not have to be the same shape, just larger than you need.

Lay the first piece of fabric on the back of the paper pattern with the right side up. Pin in place The following pieces will all be place wrong side to the paper.

Verify the fabric is in the right position by holding up to the light or pressing your finger on the sewing line. Sew in place.

Fold back the paper along the sewing line each time and trim excess fabric leaving 1/4".

Press each section open then move to the next.

I trim the finished piece leaving 1/4" around then remove the paper.

To complete the ornament you can embellish before adding a back or after.

To add the backing cut fabric larger than the paper pieced section. Lay pieces right side together and sew with a 1/4" seam along the ornament top leaving an opening at the bottom. Trim backing to same size as front. Clip the curves and across the corners. Turn right side out and hand stitch bottom close. You can add batting or opt not to use.

## **Block of the Month**

We will again be making BOM for Quilts of Valor (QOV) so start collecting your red/white/blue fabrics! Beginning Jan. 2021 a BOM will be published in the PMQG newsletter and on the website. Blocks are to be competed by the following month. Make as many blocks as you like and they will be used to make QOV for donation.

#### Guidelines:

- Use quilt shop quality 100% cotton fabrics, colors will be specified in instructions.
- Press blocks carefully as you construct them.
- Trim units/blocks to sizes indicated on instructions.
- Sign your name in permanent marker in the seam allowance.
- Drop blocks off at American Ribbon in the fabric department- please place in ZipLoc bag and label "QOV" or mail to Laura Lyman, PO Box 506, Pocono Lake, PA 18347

If you would like to donate backing fabric- 5 yards of a quilt shop quality 100% cotton fabric in a patriotic print will be appreciated.

If you would be willing to bind a quilt, please let Laura know- I will arrange to get a completed quilt to you when needed.

### PMQG 2020 SUDOKU QUILT CHALLENGE

Using a completed Sudoku puzzle, fill in the numbers on the grid below. Choose 9 fabrics plus a sashing/border/binding fabric. Number your fabrics 1-9 and layout following your puzzle grid. If you want a larger quilt, add borders.

Supplies: for 58" large lap quilt

9 coordinating fat quarters- cut (9) 6" squares from EACH

1 ¼ yds for sashing- cut (6) 1 ½" WOF, borders & binding- cut (11) 2 ½" WOF

Supplies for 43" baby quilt

9 coordinating fat quarters- cut (9) 4" squares from EACH

1 yard for sashing- cut (4) 1 ½" WOF, borders & binding- cut (8) 2 ½" WOF
