### **Minutes**

#### PMQG General Membership Meeting - September 13, 2021

President, Kathy Parrish, brought the meeting to order at 6:32. She introduced our speaker this evening, Jody Beck, a quilt designer and instructor, who presented a Trunk Show about her first 12 years as a quilter. After this presentation, our meeting started. The Treasurer's Report as printed in the newsletter was accepted by motion of Donna Conto and seconded by Lois Kirkwood; the Secretary's minutes as printed in the newsletter was accepted by motion of Lois Kirkwood and seconded by Jannette Koerner, all members were in favor of both reports.

Kathy announced upcoming events as follows: Holiday Party is set for Wednesday, December 8 at Mulally's, Glenbrook. We will need at least 30 members in attendance for a sit-down meal, choices will be Chicken Parmesan, Chicken Elizabeth, Shepard's Pie or Shrimp. Mulally's charge is \$34 per person, Kathy asked for a motion for Guild to pay \$15 toward each meal. Andrea Gullion made a motion for Guild to pay \$15, with Lois Kirkwood seconding this motion, all members were in favor. Vice President, Lorraine Hare, will provide Mystery Quilt instructions, called Stars and Stripes. Any color scheme will work, quilt will be a large throw size, with the finished top due at August's picnic. Lorraine will have full details next month. November's meeting will include making of a Christmas ornament. Kathy Parrish has 45 Community Quilt kits available for members to take home. Community Quilts will meet the fourth Monday of each month starting around 5:00, members to bring sewing machine and supplies. If you can't get to Moose Lodge by 5:00, come anytime that evening. Kathy recently took quilts to various organizations; Hospice House, Women's Resources and Meadows at Stroud, to name a few. It was also announced that there will be a clothing and shoe drive at the State Police Station on Rimrock Road, now until November 9th.

## **Holiday Dinner**

#### Mullally's Clubhouse Cafe at Glenbrook Golf Club

Our annual holiday gathering will be held on Wednesday December 8, starting at 6:00 PM

There will be four entree options:

- <u>GB Shrimp</u> Mullally's favorite, Jumbo shrimp sauteed with spinach, diced tomatoes, onion, garlic in a delectable white wine sauce; served over linguine.
- <u>Irish Shepard Pie</u> Ground Beef, celery, onions, carrots, and peas simmered together in a rich beef sauce topped with mashed potatoes.
- <u>Chicken Parmesan</u> Pan seared chicken breast with our house made marinara sauce and topped with fresh mozzarella cheese and creamy risotto.
- <u>Chicken Elizabeth</u> Sauteed chicken breast with onion, tomatoes, and mushrooms in a sherry cream sauce; with creamy risotto.

There will be salad for all, soda and ice tea with the meal and hot tea and coffee following the meal and dessert. Alcoholic beverages will be available at members expense.

The cost is \$20 per member. The guild will be contributing \$15 per person. There will be a sign up sheet at the October and November meetings. Payment can be made at either meeting.

We will have a tricky tray as per our tradition at the dinner with the proceeds to be given to a charitable organization (to be decided at November meeting). Members are encouraged to bring items which can be used.

I did make a delivery of 9 lap quilts to Hospice, 2 twin size and 2 children quilts to women's resources, 14 lap quilts to Pleasant Valley Manor, and 7 lap quilts to the Gardens at Stroud. All of the groups were very happy and grateful for the donations. This month Kim Kimler, Kathleen Hahn, Andrea Gullion and Judy Mehl made quilts and placemats. We had our first sewing get together for community quilts since before CoVid. We met at the Moose and and had a pleasant evening of socializing and sewing. AnnMarie Kizer, Linda Doll, Sheryl Flatt, Barb Wenton, Ana Rivera, Andrea Gullion, Lorraine Hare and Kathy Parrish all spent the evening working on community quilt projects.

We will try to make as many Christmas placemats as we can for Meals on Wheels again this year. The organization puts together a small holiday gift for each of their clients and love to use our placemats in them. We are asking members to make and donate as many as they can by the holiday dinner. The guild will have kits ready for those interested. Members can also just use their own fabric and any pattern they like. There is no specific size. We try to keep them around 18" X 14" at the smallest.

We will set a date for a Saturday to cut more quilt kits. Looking at Saturday dates in January and March We had a good turnout the last time. We always have fabric to cut and people who want to make and recieve quilts.

There are kits available at American Ribbon for those who want to stop by and pick up a kit. Quilts can also be dropped off there. The next community quilt night will be October 25th at the Moose Lodge starting at 6:00PM. Kits will be available as well as ironing boards and irons. Members should bring their sewing machines and basic sewing supplies.

## **Mystery Quilt 2021**

The first set of directions for the mystery quilt is included with this newsletter. The first thing to do is choose two colors that look good together, one is predominant the other provides a pop of color.

The majority of the fabric for the quilt is one color, shades of that color from dark, medium to light. The blocks have two different backgrounds that should coordinate with all the fabrics. You can make your background fabric throughout the quilt, one fabric if you prefer.

To start, either buy your fabric or use from your own fabric stash. "Stars and Stripes" is the name of the quilt, but do not be fooled by the title, any color combination would work with this quilt. We would like to see participants present either the finished quilt or top at the 2022 picnic.
