Lists will be emailed to participating members once dates are confirmed. 4-6 hours, depending on the class. Rulers and patterns must be purchased on your own. Interested members see sign-up sheets at the meetings. The workshops are:

Sew Kind of Wonderful Patterns and Rulers: 1) Flutter Wonder, 2) Giving Tree and 3) Happy Together. Each class uses a specific curved ruler: Wonder Curve, Quick Curve, or Mini Quick Curve ruler. This is a no-pin, square up method of sewing curved pieces – very addictive and sooth-

Phillips Fiber Arts ruler and 4) Spicy Spiral Pattern. Bargello curved, table runner uses a 10 degree ruler. <u>https://www.phillipsfiberart.com</u>

Saturday, June 11 9:30 am – some time after lunch (so bring your own lunch, please) There will be a supply list available at the May membership meeting. Of course, the most important item is fabric. You will need 100% white cotton, definitely not permanent press or other additives. Fat quarters are recommended for general ice dyeing and ½ yard cut (or two) will be used for ice dyed geode effect.

If anyone has ideas for workshops or programs they would like to see, please speak with either Lorraine or Kathy. If you have a workshop you would like to teach to a group, just speak up!

I YELLOW CAKE MIX 1 1/3 CUPS WATER 2 EGGS 2 TSP VANILLA MIX ALL TOGETHER AND BAKE IN A COOKIE SHEET AT 350 FOR 15-20 MINUTES [IS ALMOST DONE]

CRUMBS

4 CUPS FLOUR 3 TSP CINNAMON [OR MORE] 3 TSP VANILLA 1 1/3 CUPS WHITE SUGAR 4 STICKS [1 LB] MELTED BUTTER MIX TOGETHER, THIS IS A VERY MOIST MIXTURE. PINCH CLUMPS OF CRUMBS OVER BAKED CAKE, COVERING THE CAKE BAKE AGAIN AT 350 FOR 20 MINUTES WHEN CAKE IS COOL SPRINKLE LOTS OF CONFECTIONERS SUGAR OVER THE CRUMBS
