WALKING FOOT QUILTING: BEYOND STITCH IN THE DITCH

Feb 17, 2020 OR April 22, 2020 9:30-4:30

Equipment:

Sewing machine in good working order with manual, pedal, and cord All attachments and tools for your machine Extension table

Extra bobbins Extra needles Seam ripper

Machine quilting gloves Walking foot with quilting guide 12" or longer rotary ruler

Chaco Liner or water-soluble quilt marking pen that contrasts with your fabric

Supplies:

1 yard solid or tone on tone fabric- remove selvages and cut to square


1 ¼ yards coordinating backing (this will become your binding)

36" square cotton batting

Contrasting thread- you need to be able to see the thread on your quilt top

Class Preparation:

Mark the center of your top, then mark a nine-patch (nine connected squares) with each square measuring 9", then mark 4 ½" borders and cornerstones around your nine-patch (See Diagram below) Carefully center your marked top on your batting and backing, baste layers together.



July 2022

Using your walking foot and contrasting thread, stitch on the nine-patch lines, stitching out to the edges for the cornerstones. Using a basting stitch length, stitch the outside edge of the border. DO NOT stitch on the diagonal lines. DO NOT cut off excess fabric/batting.

Now you are ready for class!
