President's Message


Dear Members,

Minutes

General Membership Meeting: 8/10/22

Annual picnic began around 6:15 with a nice assortment of covered dishes. The meeting began at 7:15 by Vice President, Lorraine Hare. The Treasurer's Report as included with newsletter was accepted by motion of Lois Kirkwood, seconded by Judy Mehl. Kathleen McCarthy reported that she and Peggy Jo Smith performed the annual audit on July 13 for the period covering June 2, 2021 to July 2, 2022. Treasurer Ann Wingert was able to clarify any questions that were raised, after which Kathleen and Peggy Jo deemed the Guild's books were in good order. Motion to accept audit was made by Ann Marie Kizer and seconded by Cindy Dougherty.

Guild's budget for this year will be discussed at September's meeting. Financial Secretary, Lois Kirkwood, announced that at tonight's meeting, 19 members have already paid their dues, there are 22 members present tonight. Mary Santoro volunteered to be the Secretary of Guild for this coming new year.

Lorraine thanked everyone who participated in Quilt Bingo and all agreed it was a huge success and very enjoyable. Jen Walker will continue with Block of Month this coming year, as long as members want to make blocks. There was a mention that Block of Month could join in to make Quilts of Valor blocks. The refreshments for September's meeting will be provided by the Board. A volunteer is needed for Tea Time, a member brings supplies each month for hot tea at the meetings.

We will plan another cutting bee day soon to make kits for holiday placemats and kits for children's quilts.

Workshops

Workshop - Saturday, October 15, 2022

Presented by Barb Wenton Time: 9 am -3 pm @ Moose Lodge This workshop is called Diamond Trip. You can either use your own scraps cut into 2 1/2" lengths or you can use a jelly roll. I will show a sample quilt at August & September's meetings. This is a "free" pattern by Donna Jordan of Jordan Fabrics. Attached is the pattern. You can also find the pattern on the JordanFabric.com website. Donna Jordan also has a video of complete instructions to make the quilt top, which I highly recommend you watch. On the Website, click on Videos/Tutorials, click on any picture and all her videos will appear, you'll want the video called Lonely Scraps into Lovely Quilts.

She shows specific ways in which to iron the strips once they are sewn together, in order to nest the patchwork. This is a good way to use up your scraps. Usually, the accent squares are a darker fabric than the strips, so carefully choose fabrics light enough to show a contrast to the accent squares. If choosing a jelly roll, keep in mind that most of your strips should be of the same value, or at least lighter than the accent fabric. When I used a jelly roll, I purchased a light/medium gray and bought my darker gray accent fabric separate from the jelly roll. That quilt top measured 50" x 64".

The sample I'll be showing is baby quilt size, 29" x 40". Donna's pattern also includes directions to make quilts larger than 50" x 64". My sample is smaller (baby size) and was easy to adjust to a smaller size. If you plan to make a baby size top, it took 20 - 20" strips and 20- 10" strips. There are 2 vertical rows of accent squares plus a row of half squares of accent on both ends of the quilt. (Hope that makes sense).

Let me know if you plan to attend the workshop, I'll pass around a sign-up sheet. Bring your sewing machine, extension cords, basic sewing supplies, your fabric & thread, bring cutting mat & rotary cutter if you haven't already cut your fabric. Bring your lunch & beverage.

If anyone has ideas for workshops or programs they would like to see, please speak with either Lorraine or Barb. If you have a workshop you would like to teach to a group, just speak up!
