Business Meeting: September 13, 2023

Janneke Vander Ree, our speaker for the evening, presented a talk and trunk show, titled: "Diary of a Dutch Quilter". She showed many beautiful quilts and wall hangings while sharing stories behind their creation. Her book "The Princes and the Quilt" and fabric bundles were available for purchase.

The business meeting was to order by our President, Peggy Plasencia.

A motion to accept the Secretary's minutes printed in the newsletter was made by Laura Lyman. Seconded by Donna Conto. Motion carried.

A motion to accept the budget for the 2023/2024 membership year was made by Cara Staviski. Seconded by Peggy Jo Smith. Motion carried.

A motion to accept the Treasurer's report a printed in the newsletter was made by Ann Marie Kizer. Seconded by Mary Dickison. Motion carried.

Our holiday party will be held the first Wednesday of the month, December 6, 2023 at Peppi's in East Stroudsburg. The Guild has paid a portion of the overall cost. Cost is \$20 for members. There will be a sign-up sheet at the October and November meetings, November's meeting being the deadline for signing up. Meal choices are Chicken Parmesan and a fish dish.

We are asking everyone to use a dark blue batik and a contrasting light-colored blue batik. This block requires very little fabric. Hopefully members can use scraps form their stash or a fat quarter.
