#### 'Twas the night before Christmas, Quilters Version


'Twas the night before Christmas, And the quilts were not made.

#### **Block of the Month:**

We are still accepting the blue hearts from October. The September blocks have been assembled and the top looks great. I will have it at the Christmas party and will be looking for a volunteer to quilt it. The partial Jewel Box blocks are due this month.

The December block will be a simple 6" black and white nine patch block. In January we will be making a red and white snowball block and the plan is to combined the two blocks into one top.

Directions for nine patch-

Cut five 2 1/2" squares out of a tone-on-tone black fabric and four 2 1/2" squares out of any white-on-white fabric. Assemble with the black on the outside corners and center. The white for the remaining squares. Your finished block should measure 6 1/2" square. The blocks are due at the January meeting.
