BIG SHOW ANNOUNCEMENT*

After 32 years, and the designation of "longest running quilt show in Lancaster, PA", the quilt show is moving to Lebanon, PA. Just 23 miles down the road from Lancaster.

The show is April 10-13, 2024 at the Lebanon Valley Expo Center.

It is a large, spacious, facility, with ample free parking. Vendors, quilts and classes will be under one roof. This new facility will allow for wider aisles, and many more quilts in the quilt exhibits. The Expo Center has an onsite caterer who will be serving a wide variety of affordable food options. There is space for more classes and lectures. Lebanon is very close off of the Turnpike, and easily accessible for bus groups as well as individuals. For the moment the show will be known as the "Lancaster-Lebanon Quilt Show".

Block of the Month:

Thank you to Jen walker for volunteering to quilt the first of our Bingo quilts with the disappearing hourglass quilt top.

The Swedish Woven Heart quilt top is together and will be shown at the January meeting. The Jewel Box squares are due at the January meeting as well as the December blocks- black and white 9-patch. January's block will be a snowball pattern in red and white. The plan is to combined the 9-patch and the snowball blocks together for a top. The snowball block will be due at the February meeting.

DIRECTIONS FOR THE NINE PATCH - black and white

Cut five 2 1/2" squares out of tone-on-tone black fabric and four 2 1/2" squares out of any white-on-white fabric. Assemble with the black in the four corners and center. The white for the remaining squares. Your block should measure 6 1/2" square.

DIRECTIONS FOR THE SNOWBALL - red and white

Cut one 6 1/2" square out of any white-on-white fabric. Cut four 2 1/2" squares from any red fabric. Draw a diagonal line on each of the red squares. Place on the corners of the white fabric and sew on the line. Trim 1/4" away from stitch line and press red fabric away from center to create the snowball. Finished block should be 6 1/2" square.
