Block of the Month:

The March BOM - "Spool Pattern" is due at the April meeting. The Pinwheel quilt top is complete and being quilted.

The April BOM will be the "Chandelier" pattern. We will ask members to use multiple shades of blue fabrics from their stash as well as white/cream fabric which will be provided by the guild. The white/cream fabric will be precut and available at the April meeting. Members will only need one 5" square and two 2 ½" squares of blue. The completed blocks are 8 ½". Blocks are due by the May meeting. This block will be assembled and quilted for use at next year's Quilt Lovers Bingo.

PMQOV Retreat:

We would like to invite you to join us next year at St. Francis Retreat Center in Easton, PA from Jan 31st - Feb.3rd 2025, which includes the national QOV Sew Day Feb 1st.

The sewing space there will accommodate 52 quilters. Each group or individual will bring their own QOV projects and any non-QOV member will be attached to a group for the retreat. There are several types of sleeping rooms to choose from with prices ranging from \$100 - \$130 per night. Room rate includes 3 meals/day plus all day beverage service. The kitchen is usually able to accommodate special dietary needs when notified in advance.

\$50 deposit will be required by Nov. 1, 2024. Cancellations will be refunded if we can fill your spot. If you are interested, please email in response and I will put you on my email list to send reservation forms in September.



"Autumn Leaves" Exchange

This is a fabric exchange to make an "Autumn Leaves" quilt. Participants are to provide 2 yards of light-medium autumn colored batik fabrics. (Batik fabrics are the same color on the front and back, they are hand dyed fabrics). The 2 yards you provide can be any of the following combinations:

1/2 yard of 4 different fabrics

Or - 1/4 yard of 8 different fabrics

Or - Twenty-nine 2 ½" wide strips which totals 2 yards.

It is important that you provide a combination of at least 4 different fabrics. DO NOT INCLUDE FAT QUARTERS OR $1/8^{th}$ yard cuts.


The fabrics should be light to medium autumn colors such as: Beiges, golds, greens, green/grays, light rusts, etc.

The dark "leaf" fabrics will be provided by Lorraine and Barb. A "leaf" template will be provided to you.


PARTICIPANTS DO NOT INCLUDE DARK COLORED AUTUMN BATIKS.

After collecting all fabrics from participants, you will receive an assortment of everyone's fabrics to make your blocks.

This is the suggested block that you can make using 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles of fabric.



When assembling the top, alternate the position of the blocks as shown below:



Participants to provide their own border and binding fabrics, this will not be included in the exchange.

This is a project to be worked on at home, bring your completed top or quilt to August's picnic.
