Bring a lawn chair and a dish to share, as we will picnic outdoors (or indoors if necessary) after shopping. The quilt class area is large enough for us to use to enjoy refreshments in the event of rain, and the owners are prepared to permit us to use the area if needed. August 5: Picnic at Mountain View Park, Tannersville

Light rain or shine (but not if we get a hurricane) we will celebrate our annual summer picnic under cover in a pavilion at the Mountain View Park. If you don't have an email address please buddy up with a member who does to get last minute information about the picnic. Guild will supply salad greens; at the June meeting we will decide whether to use the grills. Continue another .2 miles, pass the Barley Creek Pub on your left and almost immediately make a right into Mountain View Park. Pass the Park Office, go straight up hill and follow the signs to Pavilion #1.
