Electric Quilt is a computer quilt design program produced by the Electric Quilt Company. Heavy Duty Freezer Paper

A few members asked me about the freezer paper template that was in the November Ornament Kit. The paper is sold in packages of 25 sheets that are letter paper size and are easily printed in a computer printer. The product is called "CutRite Heavy Duty Freezer Paper." It's available in quilt shops and from online quilt retailers. It holds up well enough to use multiple times as an iron on template. It costs about \$10 a package.

PMQG Challenge 2016 "Off the Page"

Challenge Requirements:

- You will be picking a number and then be given the magazine page that corresponds to that number.
- The challenge is to make a quilt that is inspired by the magazine page, you can use color, design or any thing else that inspires you from the page.
- You must return the original magazine page in the plastic cover with your challenge piece.
- Your challenge piece must have three layers and be quilted and bound.
- Embellishments are allowed.
- The quilt must measure 24" wide x 30" long.
- Important Dates: The quilts will be submitted at the March business meeting, March 9th. The quilts will be presented at the guild's April 13th meeting.
- Ribbons will be awarded.
- The challenges when submitted at the March meeting must be in a bag, with a description written on an index card describing how you were inspired by the magazine page.
- The quilt must have a label sewn onto the back of the quilt that has written on it, the name of your quilt, your name, and the date. (Other information you put on label is up to you).
- The label must be covered with a piece of muslin, basted over the label.
- A submission form must be filled out and attached to the outside of your bag.
