Total Dues for Individuals

- Club dues: None
- District and multiple district dues: \$26.00 in January and July
- International dues: \$23.00 in January and July
- Dues are prorated based on the month you join
- Our club pays the one time \$35 charter fee for all new members

Total Dues for a Couple (Family membership)

- Club Dues: None
- District and multiple district dues: \$52.00 for two in January and July
- International Dues: \$34.50 for two in January and July
- Dues are prorated based on the month you join
- Our Club pays the one time \$70 charter for fee for the two new member
- If a third or fourth family member (living in the same house) join it is half of these amounts for each additional family member

Dues and Budgets



- Total Dues for Students (18-35 years old enrolled in school)
 - Club dues: None
 - District and multiple district dues: \$ 0.00 in January and July
 - International dues: \$11.50 in January and July
 - Dues are prorated based on the month you join
 - Our club pays the one time \$35 charter fee for all new members
- Activities Budget: Funds raised as charitable donations, only used for charitable causes (not for members)
- Administrative Budget: Dues and other funds raised for operation of the club. Admin funds can only be raised while not representing the Lions as a charity.


- The Multiple District sends a quarterly newsletter to all members in the state (The Magnolia)

Name and Logo



- The official name of the association is "The International Association of Lions Clubs" or simply "Lions Clubs International."
- The name Lions was chosen on a secret ballot over several others because the lion stood for strength, courage, fidelity and vital action.
- The Lions logo consists of a gold "L" on a blue field surrounded by a gold circle. On either side of the circle is the profile of a Lion's head, one looking back upon a proud past and the other looking optimistically toward the future.
