MID-WINTER DISTRICT CONVENTION

The Lions year kicked off with a Mid-Winter District Convention at Lake Tiak O'Khata in Louisville, Mississippi, January 6-7, 2023. Lions and Leos from District 30M met to receive reports from the many committees and officers concerning the works of the members in the district (generally from Kosciusko and Philadelphia north).

About 80 members met Saturday morning to hear the reports and nominate Lions for positions on various boards and committees in the district and the state organization. Booneville Lion Veneshia Gillespie was nominated to serve a one-year term on the District Diabetes Awareness Committee and Lions Toni Stoop and Veneshia Gillespie will serve a three-year term on the Girls Leadership Committee. This committee plans and runs the Lions Girls Leadership Camp for girls in the 10th-12th grades. This year the Girls Leadership Camp will be at Lake Tiak O'Khata (hotel rooms!).

Lion Russ Lamb was nominated for Second Vice District Governor by Past Council Chairperson Lion Charlotte Dickson from the Clarksdale Evening Lions Club. There being no further nominations, Lion Russ was elected as the nominee for the state convention slate incoming officers July 1, 2023. He will serve as District Governor for

2025-2026. It wasn't all business at the Mid-Winter Convention. Friday night the Lions gathered for the Friday seafood buffet and live entertainment from Louisville Lion Tracy McCully who sang a great collection of classic country music hits and finished with wonderful rendition of "Amazing Grace."

The hospitality lounge was lively both nights and Saturday afternoon bingo raised over \$300.

Saturday night's banquet heard from International Director Ben Apeland from Bozeman, Montana and our current district governor, Lion Billy Joe Webb.



BOONEVILLE ACHIEVES MODEL CLUB STATUS

Completion of Booneville Lions Club's pledge for the Lions Clubs International Foundation Campaign 100 means the club is now a Model Club. That puts Booneville in an elite group of only 5,375 clubs out of 48,000 clubs worldwide or one of just eleven percent of clubs to achieve this honor.

The criteria to qualify as a Model Club was for our club to pledge to donate \$500 per member from 2017 to 2022.

Due to Covid, the campaign was extended, allowing clubs to complete their pledge by July 1, 2025. Booneville Lions Club completed our pledge at the Mid-Winter District Convention by presenting a check to LCIF for \$3,470 to complete our \$5,000 pledge.

Completing this pledge is a major accomplishment in the club's 75th Anniversary year.


GALEN GREER INSTALLED AS NEW LION
