
Dinner was paid for everyone there using the just enjoying each other's company.


PECANS ARE HERE!


PICK UP YOUR PECANS FROM LION RICK AT TRI-STATE INSUIRANCE

DID YOU KNOW?

Any <u>student</u> ages 18-30 joining a Lions Club only pays half of the international dues and no state dues. The one time charter fee is waived.

Lions Clubs pay dues twice a year. For a student membership it is only **\$10.75** in July and January.

New members joining any other month have dues prorated. For instance, a student member joining in November only pays \$3.58 for membership through December 31, 2022.

This is a great tool to increase membership and add some great folks to our club!

LCIF PRESENTATION & MJF AWARDS

Multi-District Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) Coordinator Andy Kalinowski visited Booneville Lions Club on November 10, 2022, to speak to the membership about reasons we support the foundation every year, install a new member, and award special recognition to three Booneville Lions.

The first order of business was installing new Lion Shelly Greer, sponsored by Lion Toni Stoop. Pictures from that ceremony are on page two of this newsletter with club President Lion Kathy Lamb.

Next, in a complete surprise to the recipients, Lion Andy asked for Lion Jim Lamb and Lion Rick Wanner to join him at the front. Reading from a letter from LCIF, he informed the group these two men were in a rare group of Lions. Both men were awarded their second Melvin Jones Fellows (MJF) award, known as a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow award.

Lion Jim Lamb received his first Melvin Jones Fellow award November 22, 2010. He has been a very active and supportive Booneville Lions Club member for 39 years.

Lion Rick Wanner received his first Melvin Jones Fellow award August 30, 2013. He has been the backbone of our club's annual pecan sales and has the tough job of being the initial contact for all our vision requests. Next, Lion Andy asked District 30M LCIF Coordinator and Booneville Lions Secretary/Treasurer Russ Lamb to come forward. Another letter of award was read from LCIF recognizing Lion Russ Lamb as the clubs newest Melvin Jones Fellow.

Lion Russ has filled several roles at the club and district level, serving as a club president, secretary/treasurer a district treasurer, and has just accepted appointment by Lions Club International Foundation Chairman and Immediate Past President Lion Douglas X. Alexander to represent LCIF to the Lions Clubs of North Mississippi.

Lion Russ received a plaque and a Melvin Jones Fellow Lions pin.

Following all that ceremony it was time to get down to business. Lion Andy presented a slide presentation he prepared exclusively for Booneville Lions. He gave us details of our past involvement with LCIF both as an annual donor and as a grant recipient. Part of the presentation included a 6-minute video from the devastation of Mayfield, Kentucky. He noted, "if you go out to the highway 45 and turn left, about 3 hours from here you will be in downtown Mavfield."

LCIF was in contact with the Lions District leadership in Kentucky within hours of the tornado sending cash to help immediately and coordinating support in the days after for food, water, and shelter. The aid was directed through the local Lions Clubs in and around Mayfield.

Because Lions are local all over the world, LCIF grants are distributed through the local district and its local Lions Club, making Lions one of the first with "boots on the ground" in a disaster. Local Lions know the area, the people, the resources, and the possibly hidden areas of need in their community. Lions Clubs International Foundation has given 1.2 billion dollars in grants since 1968. The grants cover small needs like a matching grant for vision testing equipment in Booneville, Mississippi, and large needs such as hospital equipment, humanitarian needs, disaster relief, and diabetes, to name just a few.

Mississippi has received over 2 million dollars in grants, especially for immediate help for hurricanes and tornados from Hernando and Tupelo to the Gulf Coast.

The meeting closed with rousing cheer of "Roar, Lions Roar!"


