




For Advent, let our prayer be 'Maranatha: 'The Lord is Coming'

Daughters in National March for Life January 19

The National Board of Catholic Daughters and Catholic Daughters' members from many states will gather to walk in the National March for Life January 19, in Washington, D.C.

The two days prior there is a March for Life Expo where various pro-life organizations from around the country explain their goals and disseminate information to help people in the pro-life cause. The headquarters for the March is at the Westin DC Downtown Hotel, formerly the Renaissance DC.

The pre-rally concert for the March begins at 11 a.m. on Friday, January 19, on the National Mall. The March for Life Rally is from noon to 1 p.m., and the March itself begins at 1 p.m. A new, longer route will be used this year to walk past the office buildings of US Representatives. The March concludes in front of the US Supreme Court. The Board of Catholic Daughters participates in a Mass at the Shrine of the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception the day before the March.

The March for Life brings tens of thousands of people together in the largest annual human rights demonstration in the world. According to the website, there are still more than 900,000 abortions annually.

The website says, "The goal of the national March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable." The Hyde Amendment, which has saved more than 2 million lives, is the most important pro-life policy in our nation's history, and it must be continually defended. The website says, "We envision a world where every life is celebrated, valued, and protected."

FBI has been investigating Catholics at the local parish and diocesan level

According to an article on the House Judiciary Committee website from April 10, Rep. Jim Jordan (R-OH) revealed that the FBI planted an undercover agent and used local religious organizations as "new avenues for tripwire and source development" while investigating "mainline Catholic parishes" and "diocesan leadership."

The FBI issued a document titled, "Interest of Racially or Ethnically Motivated Violent Extremists in Radical-Traditionalist Catholic Ideology Almost Certainly Presents New Mitigation Opportunities." The FBI proposal suggested the agency develop sources to report on suspicious activity at the church and diocesan levels. The documents were reviewed and approved by two senior intelligence analysts and the Richmond, VA, Chief Division Counsel. The FBI distributed the document to field offices across the country.

The House Judiciary Committee article said, "In light of this information and the serious consequences for the free exercise of Americans' First Amendment rights [to freedom of religion and free speech], Chairman Jordan issued a subpoena today to FBI Director Wray for all documents related to the FBI's actions."

In an August 9, follow-up article, Rep. Jordan revealed that the anti-Catholic memo "explicitly shows that the FBI Portland and FBI Los Angeles field offices were involved in or contributed to the creation of FBI's assessment of traditional Catholics as potential domestic terrorists."

Rep. Jordan said the committee is working "to inform our ongoing oversight of the FBI and to ensure the First Amendment guarantee of free exercise of religion is protected from government overreach."

Diane Coleman letter explains the harms in legalizing assisted suicide

Diane Coleman of Rochester, NY is president and C.E.O. of Not Dead Yet, a disability rights group that opposes legalizing assisted suicide. Her letter to the *New York Times*, was published October 4, 2023, in response to an article "A Lawsuit Aims to Expand Aid in Dying."

"This article assumes that physician-assisted suicide is acceptable health policy. However, there are two significant questions state states should address when considering its legalization: Should it be a medical treatment, and what are the harms of legalizing it?

"On the first, many in the medical profession oppose physician-assisted suicide, including the American Medical Association, which holds that it is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would pose serious societal risks."

"On the second question, major disability rights organizations oppose physician-assisted suicide because it increases the risks that people with disabilities face in receiving medical care, as they are already too often subject to unequal treatment.

"Adding physician-assisted suicide as a medical treatment exposes people with disabilities to systemic pressures to end their lives in the context of life-threatening illnesses. Before adopting physician-assisted suicide, or any extension of it, we need to ask, answer and understand the implications of such a step."

Funding for AIDS relief in Africa keeps prolife protections in place

According to Population Research Institute (the US House reauthorized the US President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) and kept pro-life protections in place. Despite the Biden Administration fighting to include abortion funding, the House extended PEPFAR for one more year with an amendment to prevent funding or promoting abortions overseas. After heated debate, the bill passed 216-212.

Everyone must be helped to become aware of the intrinsic evil of the crime of abortion. In attacking human life in its very first stages, it is also an aggression against society itself. Politicians and legislators, therefore, as servants of the common good, are duty bound to defend the fundamental right to life, the fruit of God's love.
