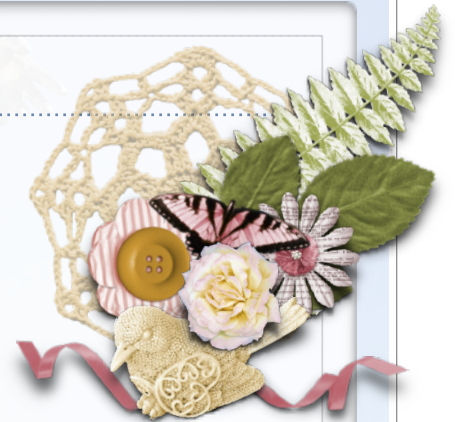

Experiencing the Easter Season

The Easter season is a very special time of the Liturgical Year because we experience so much of the love and mercy of God. During this special season, we experience the Divine Mercy of Jesus; he appears in the upper room, the Emmaus walk, Christ the Good Shepherd and the list goes on. I am going to focus on the Divine Mercy of Jesus.

The devotion was actively promoted by Pope St. John Paul II. On April 30, 2000, the Canonization of Faustina Kowalska took place and the Sunday after Easter was officially designated as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy in the General Roman Calendar. On April 22, 2001, which was one year after establishing Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope St. John Paul II re-emphasized its message in the resurrection context of Easter:

Jesus said to St. Faustina one day: "**Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy**". Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity.

The devotion on Divine Mercy Sunday grew rapidly after its designation by Pope St. John Paul II and is now widely celebrated by Catholics. The Divine Mercy image is often carried in processions on Divine Mercy Sunday, and is placed in a location in the church so that it can be venerated by those who attended Mass.

The liturgical celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday reflects the devotional elements of Divine Mercy – the first prayer of that Mass beginning with: Heavenly Father and God of Mercy, we no longer look for Jesus among the dead, for He is alive and has become the Lord of Life. This opening prayer refers to Divine Mercy as the key element in the plan of God for salvation and emphasizes the belief that it was through mercy that God gave his only Son for the redemption of mankind, after the fall of Adam.

Pope St. John Paul II, who died in April 2005 on the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday, was himself beatified on Divine Mercy Sunday, May 1, 2011, by his successor, Pope Benedict XVI, and was canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 27, 2014, by Pope Francis. **The following is a few excerpts from the diary of St. Faustina.**

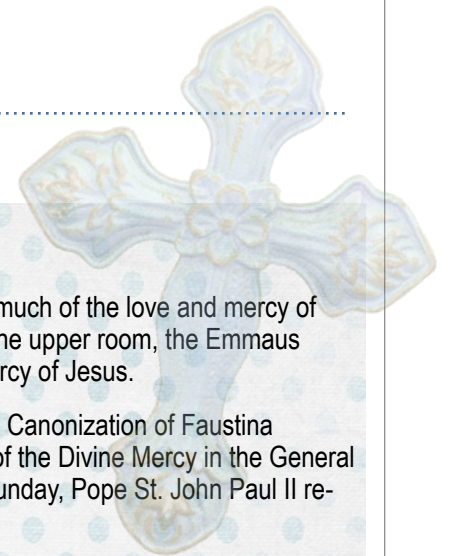
Our Lord, Himself, gave us the Chaplet of Divine Mercy through Saint Faustina, and He made it clear to her that it was **for the whole world**. St. Faustina's diary records Jesus saying: "Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you... Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death... When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Savior... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if they were to recite this Chaplet only once, they would receive grace from My infinite mercy... Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will."

In 1931 Our Lord granted a vision to Saint Faustina with two rays emanating from His heart, one red and the other pale. As she gazed intently at Him, He said to her, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature: **Jesus, I Trust in You**... I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over its enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death."

Our Lord also said in St. Faustina's diary: "At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief instant, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My passion."

That is **how** the Lord loves and cares for us. Jesus calls each and every one of us to sainthood. At Baptism we are labeled as a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of His own. Jesus values each of us and died for each of us, **personally**. Jesus gave us Divine Mercy to assist us in this world as we assist others and to assist us at our time of death to be with him in Paradise. Do you pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy?

The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy

How to Recite the Chaplet

The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

1. **On the Cross:** Make the Sign of the Cross

2. **Optional Opening Prayers:**

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. **Our Father**

4. **Hail Mary**

5. **The Apostle's Creed**

6. **The Eternal Father: (Prayed on the "Our Father" beads)**

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. **On the Ten Small Beads of Each Decade**

For the sake of His Sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. **Repeat for the remaining decades**

Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. **Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)**

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. **Optional Closing Prayer**

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

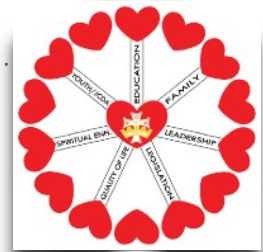

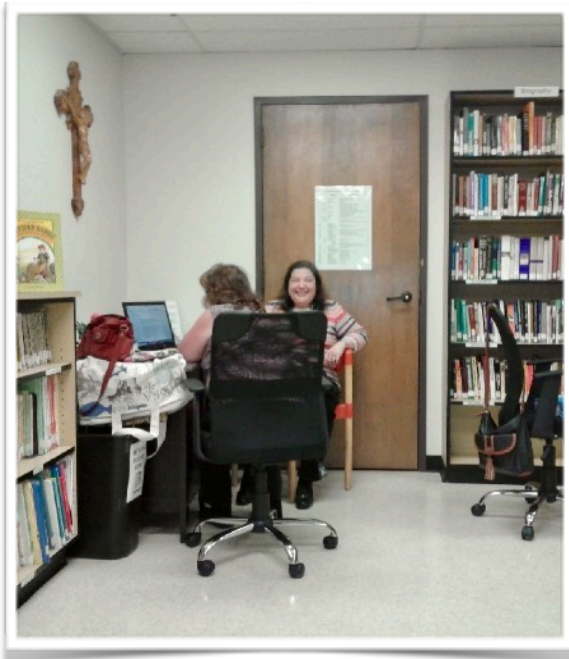
Financial Review:

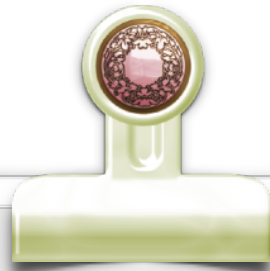

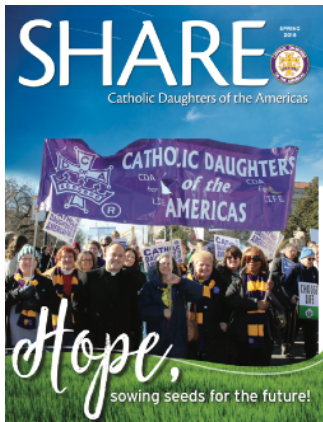

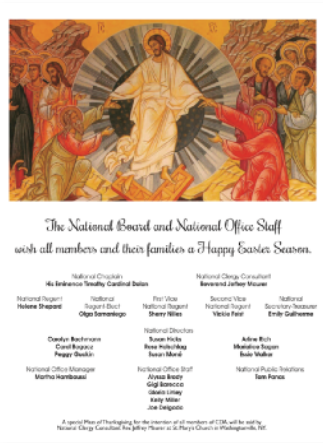

Call to Order by Gloria Riley, Regent at 7:04 pm.

Opening ceremony

Installation of New Members – No new members this month

Reading of Minutes by Sheryl Andrews, Recording Secretary There were no changes to the March Minutes. They were approved as written.

Reading of Correspondence by Sheryl Andrews, Recording Secretary – A card was sent to our Court from Court St. Helena of the Cross #2679 and a donation was made in the amount of \$10.00 to our Court.

Treasurer’s Report by Charlotte Prieve (see attached)

Bills were presented to the Court by Sheryl Andrews, Recording Secretary – No Bills were presented this month

Committees

Nominating - Karen Doolittle, chairperson of the Nominating Committee announced the members who will be running as officers for the next term. See the nomination attached to the Minutes.

Mass Cards - Peggy O’Neal will give Mass Cards out in sets of 5 to any member who would like them. When you pick up your Mass Cards, you will need to bring back either the money or remaining Mass Cards to the next meeting. This is the easiest way to keep up with the cards. Peggy O’Neal will try to get together a schedule so people can sign up to start working the Community Weekends. We will have a table at the monthly Community Weekend to sell Mass Cards. She will go over the forms that need to be filled out when she gets things set up. There should be a website in the Newsletter where you can purchase Mass Cards.

New Business

- A. CGSC 40th Anniversary Celebration: We should bring finger type desserts (cookies, cupcakes, etc.) to the Social hall on Saturday, April 21, 2018. You should bring items before or after 10:00 am Mass. Bring your items in throw away containers. There will be a church picnic after Mass. We may be asked to assist during the event. If we are needed, an email will be sent out asking for volunteers. April 11th and 18th is the committee meeting regarding the Anniversary Celebration. All food is free.
- B. Read Across America: Anne Martin, State Chairperson for Read Across America will deliver 6 boxes of books to be assorted by grade and distributed. Jan Papciak, Director of Social Ministries will assist us with the distribution. As of April 2, 2018, Ms. Martin has not set a date for pickup. An email will be sent out asking for volunteers. Gloria Riley will keep us updated as to when the books will arrive.
- C. Jan Papciak asked if the Court would be interested in distributing baby bottles after Mass on Mother's Day and collecting the bottles filled with coins on Father's Day. The money will go to help pregnant ladies. **A Motion was made by Maria Vittuci to participate with distributing the baby bottles on Mother's Day and picking them up on Father's Day. Marieanne Suarez seconded the Motion. It was voted on and Approved.** Marieanne Suarez will set up a sign up sheet with Signup Genie and email out for members to sign up to help.
- D. Community Sunday is April 14th and 15th. Volunteers are needed to staff the tables after the Saturday 5:30 pm Mass and the 9:00 am and 10:45 am Masses. This will be our membership drive which will be held twice a year. We will be selling Mass Cards at all Community Weekends. We will have the banner and tablecloth out this weekend. A Signup Genie email will be sent out for members to sign up. Peggy O'Neal asked if we will have any handouts at the event to put on the tables. There will be handouts. Katherine Lee should have a link on the website to the Mass Cards so we can let people know that they can also get Mass Cards off the website.
- E. There was a \$200 donation that is intended to help out our Hope Center ministry. Since their primary need is for clothing, it was asked that the money be used to purchase clothing for the Hope Center. **Karen Doolittle made the Motion that the \$200 donation be used to buy clothing for the Hope Center. Maria Vittuci seconded the Motion. It was voted on and Approved.**

Old Business

- A. Hope Center Manna Bags Report by Priscilla Hargraves: the Manna Bags were a huge success. We made 47 bags which gave each person 2 – 1 gallon bag of food. The basket of goods collected at each meeting or the Hope Center collected about \$130 – \$150 worth in donations. The Hope Center is really in need of reading glasses.
- B. An email survey was sent out to the members to determine the preferred day for the upcoming meetings. Fourteen members participated in the survey and it was determined that the meetings will stay on the first Thursday of the month.
- C. Nancy's Rosaries: How to make cord rosaries was shown to the members by Charlotte Prieve and Marieanne Suarez. Father John Ugobueze at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center is excited about receiving the rosaries. Members contributed towards purchasing the "Praying the Rosaries" pamphlets and providing the rosaries. The date to deliver the rosaries is Tuesday, May 8th at 2:00pm in his office at the VA.

- D. Quarterly CDA fundraiser: A “Saturday Ladies Breakfast” after 8:30am Mass was discussed. We need a chairperson to head this event up.
- E. We need 2 or 3 members to volunteer for the Fundraising Committee. The committee’s only job is to come up with 1 – 3 fundraising ideas to present to the Court. Once the Court decides on a fundraiser then a committee will be formed for that fundraiser.

Reports from Financial Secretary, Priscilla Hargraves:

- A. Fish Fry Desserts donations: A big thank you is sent out to all that helped at the Fish Fry. The dessert donation raised \$250.50.
- B. We made \$310 in Mass Cards. Half will go to the State and half will stay in the Court account.
- C. Membership dues: Membership dues were due in February. Almost all members have paid. There are six members who have not paid their membership dues as of the meeting.
- D. Not sure if we will have enough handmade rosaries to take to the VA in May but we are collecting rosaries to take with us and 100 Rosaries were purchased to take to the hospital as well. We need to let others know we are collecting Rosaries. We can post on the parishes Facebook page, on the Parish App and possible in the bulletin. Sheryl Bihler-Lopez said that maybe this could be a twice a year event.
