Assisting with the medical and educational needs of our ohana continues to grow. In 2003, we provided educational scholarships and life threatening illness assistance to 39 employees. In 2015, just in those same 2 categories, we assisted 218! And, if you add in the new programs initiated during those years in medical (surgical and dental awards) and education (mentoring, college excellence, elementary programs), the total number of "touches" with our employees has risen to over 1700. Truly remarkable! With your sustained contributions, our hope is to grow each year to meet the needs of the Hualalai Ohana.

SCHOOL SCHOOL STATE OF THE STAT

The Junior Board typically hosts one major fundraiser each year to help support the Foundation. In 2015, they held the 2nd Annual 5K Paint Run during Festive. It was a successful day with over 150 members, family and friends participating.

PreK - 12th Grade Scholarship Award

Awards are granted to eligible applicants for private school tuition on a sliding scale, which is based on gross income, financial need, size of household and academic merit.



Award Range: \$750.00-\$4,000.00

Higher Education Scholarship Award

The Higher Education scholarship award follows the same sliding scale as the Prek-12th Grade Award and provides college tuition assistance for employees, their spouses and children.



Award Range: \$750.00-\$4,000.00

Honor Roll Award & Ceremony

This program recognizes the academic work of employee children in 6th-12th grade. Students must achieve a 3.0 GPA. Recipients and their ohana are invited to attend the carnival and awards ceremony.



Award Range: Middle School \$ 75.00

High School \$150.00

Early Childhood Educational Tools

Leap Frog Learning Tools

Each November, the foundation supports early childhood education by providing at home learning tools. Children between 3 – 8 years old receive a Leap Pad 3 tablet and \$20.00 game download card. This is a favorite program of the employees and a good investment in helping young children to associate learning with fun.

In our partnership with the **Dollywood Foundation, the Imagination Library** delivers a new book each month to children from birth until five years old. The books are addressed to the children, which creates excitement when they get their own mail.

Educational Opportunity Award

This program supports **personal and professional development** for children and adults. The intent of the program is to enrich the employees' families and through them, their community. Coursework is relevant to the employee's career path; for the child curriculum based programs, camps or field trips qualify.

Adults and children can both apply this award toward classes that create a greater understanding of **Hawaiian culture** and our island community.

Lifeplan Mentor Program

The mentor program focuses on the public school sector by helping to mentor teens in life skills and college/career readiness. Resort employees and other adults volunteered alongside the teachers to mentor students in their 45-minute homeroom class. This partnership between the Foundation, school, mentors, teachers, and youth has made a positive difference in the school environment and for the students.

The 2015-2016 school year concluded the Foundations 5-year pilot program at nearby Kealakehe High School. The school administration considered it such a success they have opted to continue the program with internal support from the Department of Education.



Financial assistance with life-threatening illnesses and important surgeries help families concentrate on healing.

Serious Illness Award

Access to quality healthcare can be a challenge. In the event of a serious illness or injury, employees and their family must travel off-island for treatment. When this occurs, the Foundation helps to ease the burden by helping with patient co-pays, prescriptions, and travel related expenses. Proudly, the Foundation has placed no cap on this award and supports employees throughout their time of need.

Surgical Assistance Award

Some medical conditions, though not life-threatening, require necessary treatment to avoid disability. Due to the costs involved, some employees postpone the surgery until they are no longer able to work. The Foundation's Surgical Award provides up to \$2,000 to help with necessary routine and serious surgeries.

Dental Assistance Award

In 2012, it was brought to the attention of the Medical Committee that many employees suffer from a wide range of dental issues. The Committee then developed a program to support those in need of urgent dental procedures. This award provides up to \$1,000.00 toward necessary dental treatments.

The Foundation receives income from three critical areas:


The Annual Appeal-This pure form of philanthropy allows us to provide access to quality education, educational support tools and medical aid for the employee 'ohana year-round.





