Pet Friendly Plates help support spaying and neutering across Idaho. Weiser River Animal Shelter and Rescue will be applying next year for some of the funds that are being raised by this license plate, up to \$5000. The cost to buy Pet-Friendly plates for your vehicle is an additional \$35.00 the first year and \$25.00 each year after that. This fee is above the annual cost of registering your vehicle.

Site Progress for the Animal Shelter

Here is an update on a potential site for the shelter. This property is located just before turning left off of Airport Road at the gate into the airport. It is easily identified, as it has a wide gate in the middle of the fence around the airport, and much of the property is black gravel. A 100' x 60' shed is situated in the right hand corner of the property.

As of today, we have done the first step and received approval by the Airport Board. We plan to go to the City Council in February to discuss our plans. (This property is owned by the city, but is not in the city limits). Once we have our architectural plans available, we will then go back to the City Council to have that approved, and to discuss our cost of leasing the space. Our understanding is that we cannot buy the property but can lease it if the City Council agrees with our plans.

After getting the City Council to agree to allow us to lease the property (less than two acres), we will need to go in front of the County Planning and Zoning Board to get their approval, and then on to the County Commissioners for theirs. After getting all of the approvals as well as an agreement on the lease, it will probably be May before we could have final approval and be able to move forward.

Today we have discussed buying the large shed adjoining this property with the owner. Before that could happen, there would be some inspections done, and a survey of the property (P & Z must have a legal description of the property for their records). We also need to determine if the water in the system there is potable for humans, and have the electricity in the building inspected to be sure it can supply what we need.

We understand that the property is in the flood plain, so we also need a determination on how that might impact what we want to

We will have a individual familiar with construction inspect the large shed to be sure there are no problems with the structure. This structure is all metal, inside and out. There may have been chemicals mixed in the building so we'll need an inspection to see if there is any chemical residue that would need to be cleaned up before we begin construction on the inside.

There is still a lot to do to have this property ready for us to move in. But having the building would give us a good start and its size might handle all of the shelter we wish to build at this time. There will also be quite a lot of empty ground available for parking and possible expansion in the future. Until we have had an architectural drawing prepared, we will not know how things will be.

As most of you know, we were unable to obtain approval on the first piece of property we wanted to buy. It is possible that the basic problem that caused that rejection before will not interfere with the current airport project. As we move through the approval process we will learn if that is the case at this new site.

As this shelter is a facility that is really needed in this community, we are hopeful that our city and county officials will work with us to make it happen.
