Indian elephants have smaller ears but relatively broader skulls and larger trunks than African elephants. The toes are large and broad. Quite unlike their African cousins their abdomen is proportionate with the weight of the body. The African elephant has a large abdomen as compared to the skull. Indian elephants are found in India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Thailand and many other Asian countries. They live in grasslands and forests. They consume 150 kgs of plant matter every day which are tall grasses, various species of plants and trees. Illegal killing of elephants, flourishing ivory trade and their shrinking habitat pose a great threat to their existence.
