As most everyone is aware of, the parish merger recommendations are in as of March 10, 2014 and will be submitted to the Archbishop for his approval. As of right now St. Josephs parish will be merging with St. Frances Cabrini, and Immaculate Conception will merge with Queen of the Universe but will remain open as designated worship sites for 1 year. I never would imagine that our community would ever close a church, let alone close 2 of them and combine parishes together, but that is the case when the Archdiocese sees a sharp decline in mass attendance, school enrolment and overall non participation in our faith. Those factors will also play a role in our council and its future; we also see that same trend. This year I have received nearly 70 members who are up for suspension for non-payment of dues, and have only taken in 3 new members so far. 
