Working together with our community partners we completed many charitable and uplifting projects that benefited many, and helped strengthen relationships in the area. Some examples included 100 food and gift baskets were delivered to struggling local families, making their Christmas a little brighter. Nearly 200 new coats distributed to children in need throughout the community. Big thanks to Terry and Liz Hughes for directing those projects and all the volunteers for supporting them. In addition, in conjunction with the Christmas Gift Baskets, the Council delivered 50 pairs of athletic pants to Veterans at The Delaware Valley Veterans Home.

In November we shared an important message to the community to keep Christ in Christmas by posting 8 signs and a manger scene throughout busy areas in Lower Bucks County. Around Thanksgiving we invited several area seniors groups and veterans who rarely enjoy the company of others to our Council Home for a Thanksgiving meal, along with entertainment from a local a capalla group. Thanks to Mark Cordero for coordinating that event. Earlier in that month, we provided comfort to 35 families who lost their loved one's last year with a memorial Mass honoring their legacy, followed by a meal together.

In October Bill Chase and John Merrick lead a work party securing an earlier donated gazebo at the Delaware Valley Veterans Home with footings, a composite base, along with grading and seeding work. Jubilee Year of Mercy

From the Holy Father, through Bishop Kurt and his designate, Fr. Higgins, to Our Lady of Perpetual Help, the Holy Door at the Church has been blessed and dedicated for the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Catholic faithful who pass through this door during this Holy Year of Mercy will gain plenary indulgences for themselves and for intercession of others provided that:

- 1. Three "Our Fathers", three "Hail Mary's" and three "Glory Be to the Father" are prayed for the intention of the Holy Father at each visit.
- The faithful receive the sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist within a reasonable time of the visit.

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. One confession may serve several visits, but receiving the Holy Eucharist and prayers for the Holy Father, are necessary for each visit to gain each plenary indulgence.

You and your family are welcome to visit OLPH to receive these graces. Sunday liturgy is 11 am. The church will be open during other times for visits. OLPH also will have special Penance Services with visiting priests during the Holy Year.


