OUR BLESSED VIRGIN MOTHER'S ROSARY K of C CRUSADE after the recent 2015 savage beheading of American journalist, Jim Foley, was inspired by his faith in saying the ROSARY before his beheading.

Journalist Jim Foley reflected with deep gratitude on the goodness of his Catholic university education and how it taught him to trust in the power of the Blessed Mother's Most Holy Rosary. This power was revealed to him during his own captivity in Libya in 2011, tried his faith as he abandoned all hope and supplicated to Our Lady for his salvation, earthly or spiritual, and proved its power with his release and that of a fellow journalist.

"The Rosary record is long and brilliant. It is as if each miracle of prayer starting with the crucifixion of our Lord, connected by the thread of humanity's hope in salvation, creates a living rosary of unending decades upon which all faithful can draw strength and should draw strength. Consider Pope Leo X in the sixteenth century was almost kidnapped off shore in the Adriatic; followed by the witness of the miracle of Lepanto. Don John of Austria was dedicated to the Rosary by the Pope, Saint Pius V. The Rosary went into action, displayed from the topmost masthead. - * October 13 "I am the Lady of the Rosary! Continue to pray the Rosary every day."

As a nation dedicated to Her Immaculate Conception, the Most Holy Rosary Crusade will be said by all Knights of Columbus councils worldwide, and by Catholics, and Christians internationally BEFORE EACH MEETING. We pray and ask most fervently that this endeavor placed under the patronage of Blessed Francesco Martin, our chosen patron of this crusade, show us the path of God's will.

Pope Francis' Historic Visit to Philadelphia and His Resounding Message That God is Love.
