PROPOSAL

The Draft Plan of Subdivision application and the applications to amend the Official Plan and Zoning By-law is proposing five buildings with two eight-storey midrise building components along Bloor Street West and five tower components with heights of 25, 36, 41, 43 and 45 storeys within four mixed-use blocks located at 5230 Dundas Street West, 3825 Bloor Street West and 0 Beamish Drive. The proposal includes 2,387 residential units, 4,859 square metres of non-residential gross floor area, J-shaped public road and a 1,900 square metres of public parkland.

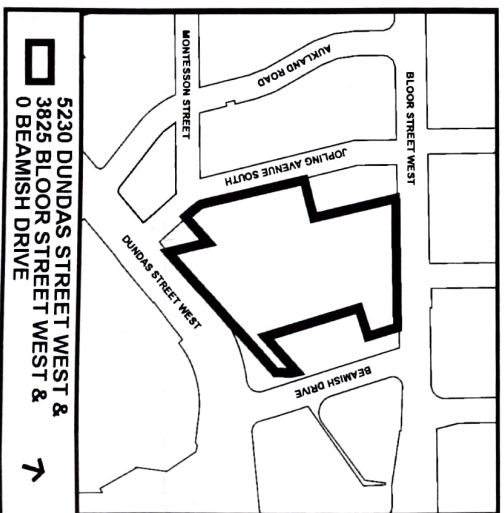
FURTHER INFORMATION

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Official Plan Amendment, passing or refusal of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment and decision of the City of Toronto in respect to the proposed Draft Plan of Subdivision, you must make a written request to the City Clerk Attention: Nancy Maruts, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out above.

Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment

Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused or the proposed zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

Draft Plan of Subdivision Appeal: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Council of the City of Toronto in respect of the proposed plan of subdivision before approval authority gives or refuses to give approval to the draft plan of subdivision, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal.



People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, emails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.

Many Committee, Board and Advisory Body meetings are broadcast live over the internet for the public to view. If you speak at the meeting you will appear in the video broadcast.
