A <u>Note From Sophia's Mom</u> The Virtue of Gratitude ...

The first year having gone through the days of life without Sophia physically here is coming to a close. At some point in October, I realized that I was not going to be able to "trick" myself- my mind nor my body, into somehow believing that *this* fall, *this* November, wasn't going to feel any different than any of the other 330 difficult days before. There was no fooling the stored pain of last fall as I watched my brilliant, beautiful angel slowly, brutishly, physically decline from DIPG.

Diffuse Intrinsic Pons Glioma. An **extremely** rare form of pediatric brain cancer. Terminal. A Death Sentence. Game Over. Unbelievable.

Just. Like. That.

Right now, the best treatment available for DIPG is Proton Therapy. And that is not a cure, it is a treatment. It is Time. It is a Gift.

And if Proton is well-tolerated for the child, as a parent you feel SO grateful. So grateful for the window of time you receive as a result of your child being temporarily symptom-free of their diagnosis, yet radioactive...

Every minute, of every day, especially from the second we learned Sophia's diagnosisthat time together was a gift. I now know: That period of time together was our Miracle.

Even though our miracle for Sophia didn't take the shape that *we* imagined, the one that *we* had all hoped and prayed; for an inexplicable miraculous healing...

The miracle did, however, take a different form. And it would be unjust to Sophia- to the root of her very being, her existence- to deny the miracle in the beauty of the wonderfully good, miraculous months we shared with Sophia after her diagnosis. Thanks to her courageous, fighting spirit, so full of love and grace.

She gave me strength then and she does now.

Hearing the phrase, "No real options" when dealing with your child's life in a medicalcrisis has the power to corner you into a place of disbelief and hysteria ...at machspeed.

Brain Tumor + Cancerous + Pediatric + Extremely Rare + Inoperable = Terminal.

Why is DIPG terminal? NO Funding. Means NO Research. No research means NO significant progress. And it means nowhere even close to a Cure.

As you select your Annual Appeals this season, **please** keep the 600 (approximate) families, in the world, that were told this year their child has DIPG. And their child, who was seemingly perfectly healthy, is now 99.9% likely going to die in the next few months.


No child should have to endure the despicable cruelty and the horror that comes of DIPG.
