As events are starting back up, KDA has provided some guidance for best practices. This was per the previous Ad Astra plan, so be sure to check with your local leaders for any updates or restrictions.

Guidance for Livestock Competitions and Shows

The Kansas Department of Agriculture knows that the COVID-19 pandemic is making it difficult to plan for livestock events. Show managers must make the best decision for each event with local, state, and federal regulation and health guidelines in mind. If a livestock show or competition is to take place, we strongly encourage event organizers to do their part to provide a safe, reliable environment and protect the health of participants.

The state's framework to resume business operations — "Ad Astra: A Plan to Re-Open Kansas" — was established via Executive Order No. 20-29 issued by Governor Laura Kelly on April 30, 2020. Under the re-opening framework, competitions and events are allowed to resume operations beginning in Phase Two under certain conditions. However, fairs, festivals, carnivals, parades, and large entertainment venues with capacity of 2,000+ are not allowed to open until Phase Three, and then only with distancing and mass gathering rules in place as outlined below.

It is important to note that **local governments retain the authority to impose additional restrictions**, and any specific guidelines not outlined by the Governor's re-opening framework are the jurisdiction of each local government. However, the new Executive Order states that while local governments may implement more restrictive orders or provisions, they must continue to allow the performance of essential functions identified in the Kansas Essential Functions Framework (KEFF).

Competitions, Livestock Shows in Phase Two

Competitions that are not affiliated with fairs or festivals can resume in Phase Two of the Re-Opening Plan **IF**:

- At least 6 feet of distance can be maintained between individuals or groups.
- Fundamental cleaning and public health practices are followed.
- **AND** they avoid any instances in which more than **30 individuals** are in one location and are unable to maintain 6 feet of distance with only infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity. This does not limit the total occupancy of a facility, but requires that facilities limit mass gatherings in areas and instances in which physical distancing cannot be maintained such as in entrances, lobbies, locker rooms, etc.
- Concessions must not include self-service food or beverages.

Livestock shows and competitions are events that involve competitive classes in show rings and **do not** include any entertainment or other group activities.

2019 FLOODS LEAVE WORK TO BE DONE

A Message from THE KHC TRAILS COMMITTEE

While summer has not officially started, the weather for it has arrived quickly!

With the heat, hopefully the last of the flood remnants will disappear from 2019, although 2020 has brought about its own set of issues.

Please remember with our summer storms to stay off of wet and muddy trails to avoid damaging trail tread!

Whether it's the social distancing and people trying to find an outlet for being shut in or that camping has suddenly gotten very popular this year, word on the street is that it's getting tough to find spots in our equestrian campgrounds to stay for the weekend.

We do have a couple of campgrounds in the state that are very specific to equestrians and are pretty strict on that (Perry and Hillsdale Lake) but other parks are not quite to that level yet. Hopefully a good solution with the parks can be made to help get the other equestrian campgrounds to the same level.

In the meantime what we need to do is reserve sites well in advance and we (horse people) need to get out there and camp and show that we love our camping and we are dedicated to these sites!

On another point, while we are not seeing a surge in traffic yet, other states are experiencing a new user out on their trails. E-bikes have been appearing across the country and have been given access as a means for people with disabilities to access areas of land they may otherwise not be able to see.

The national Back Country Horsemen of America organization is against E-bikes for a number of reasons, including the safety of other trail users, including but not limited to equestrians, and for the increase of trail wear and tear from a motorized unit that can be caused by these bikes.

It's unclear at this point how much impact these will have in our state but we have been told that they will be allowed access; as trail chairs, Jim and I will be discussing the best means to promote our safety on the trails and promote education of right of way and utilization of etiquette for all users with the State Parks.

Watch for updates regarding these matters in the future. As always, a horseman's best practice is to have good training at home in the controlled environment introducing a variety of different moving objects, noisy or non-noisy; natural and non-natural and to find out what your horse's particular vices are to help have the best experience you can have out on the trail in a non-controlled environment.

Saturday June 6th in the afternoon we will be having the general membership meeting for the Back Country Horsemen of Kansas State Chapter, 5 pm at Perry Lake--please join us if you can!

Also, June 19-21 at Eisenhower State Park is the Best of America by Horseback ride that will be televised on RFD-tv; make plans to join us and represent our state!

Stay tuned for further trail issues and accomplishments--send your thanks to those great volunteers that have been out there cleaning up and trimming up the trails you get to enjoy!!

For the horse campers out there, two Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, State Parks are now designated for equestrian use, only. Meaning, non-equestrians may not reserve spots in Wild Horse Camp, Perry State Park (Lake Perry) or Saddle Ridge Campground, Hillsdale State Park (Hillsdale Lake). You must have a horse to camp in these areas as designated equestrian campground use only.
