DEB: What exactly is the AOTS Connection?

JENNIFER: AOTS Connection is a friendly, supportive Facebook group started for independent amateurs in the Arabian horse community that prefer to 'do it themselves' by training and showing their own horses. This site allows amateurs to meet and get to know one another, as well as provide support and encouragement, to help put the fun back in showing for those that aren't part of a training barn.

DEB: How did the AOTS Connection start?

JENNIFER: The group actually started from a topic on the FB group 'Promoting Positive Change For the Arabian Breed.' A little over a year ago there was lots of discussion of how to encourage new people to the breed and how to get them into the show ring. Eventually the discussion started to include reaching owners that didn't show with big name trainers. The discussion was mixed-many were for bringing in such people and others were against it, with the popular opinion that such people weren't serious about the breed/showing/etc. and that they brought poor quality horses/horsemanship to the ring.


